Something for Everyone

Covid-19 bit hard but we survived—just. Although the pandemic made us cut back on the number of new titles, we are determined to continue publishing for everyone. So for the first six months of 2023, we will still be releasing at least one title from each of these categories—picture book, early reader, middle grade, graphic novel, fiction, nonfiction, photography and food.

Two picture books start us off: Chinese New Year in Singapore: Dragons in Chinatown is the second title in the Celebrations in Singapore series by Valerie Pereira and Kwee Eng Liau. It follows Christmas in Singapore: Stars on Orchard Road, which was released last year. The other picture book is the first in a new series, Poems to Keep, to introduce children to some of Singapore's bestloved poems. 2 Mothers in a HDB Playground by the late Arthur Yap will be interpreted by Adia Tay, who wrote and illustrated the 2022 Hedwig Annuar Children's Book Award finalist What If the Winds Tears My Kite?

February sees our first non-fiction title

Singapore Flings: Literary Stopovers from

Chekhov to Tagore by Ira Nadel. Professor

Nadel, formerly at Nanyang Technological

University, explores how 21 famous authors,
including Charles Chaplin, Pablo Neruda and

Joseph Conrad, among others, visited Singapore
and remained fascinated by her. The first middlegrade title this season is Freddy the Dogged

Rescuer by Swapnil Mishra, the long-awaited
sequel to Freddy the Eager Fundraiser. This time

Freddy is fundraising for a dog shelter.

In March, the two releases are a picture book and a photographic title. The ABCs of Old Singapore by Hwee Goh and Jayne Ong is an illuminating peek into legends like Sang Nila Utama and Admiral Zheng He. It is the first of a new ABC series on aspects of Singapore. A Garden for All: Reflection. Inspiration. Solace. by Wong Sher Maine and Nicholas Leong captures Singapore's first UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Botanic Gardens, in a completely new light.

Three titles follow in April: another picture book, a second non-fiction title, and a longlisted novel from last year's Epigram Books Fiction Prize (EBFP). The picture book **Don't Call Me Cute!** is **Ashton** Wu's debut as a writer and illustrator. It's the tale of Xin Yi, who is smart, strong and creative but the grown-ups only think she is cute. Xiaomi: From Ten to Infinity by Fan Haitao is the inside story of how a humble Chinese startup took on Apple and became one of the world's biggest smartphone makers in less than a decade. In 2019, it became the youngest company to make the Fortune Global 500 list. The EBFP longlisted title is **Claiming** Susan Chin by Tham Cheng-E. His third novel centres on the investigation of an airplane crash and the mystery surrounding the sole survivor, a Singaporean teenager with Down syndrome.

In May, the short story collection **Eternal Summer of My Homeland** by **Agnes Chew**contains searing tales of ordinary people caught between duty and desire. The other release is a middle-grade novel **Escape from Bussorah Street** by **A. K. Zai**. Twelve-year-old Zak dreads the rite-of-passage circumcision ritual—he's not ready to be a grown-up. But World War Two arrives and changes everything.

We end the first half of the year with four titles. How to Date a Dozen Men by Samara Gan is a semi-autobiographical graphic novel on the dating scene here. Gardens at Phoenix Park by Wong Souk Yee, longlisted for the 2022 EBFP, is a tale of three friends' struggles against political oppression in Singapore. Her first novel, Death of a Perm Sec, was shortlisted for both the 2015 EBFP and 2018 Singapore Literature Prize. Mammals Get Schooled! by Maureen Yeo and Elizabeth Goh, the first in a series called Classroom Critters, is a graphic novel for early readers. The fourth title is Masak-masak: Asian Cooking for Kids by Elena Yeo and Arti Daryanani.




Chinese New Year is finally here and there's so much to prepare.

She is also the author of *Stars on Orchard Road*, a picture book that is part of a series on how children celebrate different festivals in Singapore. *Dragons in Chinatown* is inspired by her family traditions.



Kwee Eng Liau is an Early Childhood Educator and a self-taught illustrator. While pursuing a bachelor's degree in architecture, she found her passion in figure drawing and story making. She enjoys reading picture books with her niece and traveling with her spouse. *Dragons in Chinatown* is her first picture book.



Arthur Yap is one of Singapore's best known poets who was awarded the Cultural Medallion in 1983 for his contributions to literature. His work, which often uses simple language and Singlish, paints a picture of everyday Singaporean life. An important figure in the development of Singaporean poetry, Arthur Yap published several collections and was awarded the National Book Development Council award for poetry for only lines (1971), down the line (1980) and man snake apple & other poems (1986). He also wrote a collection of short stories: Noon at Five O' Clock: The Short Stories of Yap (2014) and had several solo art exhibitions throughout his career. He passed away in 2006.



Adia Tay is a singer, songwriter, poet and author. She published her first music album *Kintsugi* and poetry collection *Close Enough* in 2019. When she isn't noodling away on her guitar, doodling on paper or brooding over beautiful words, she writes stories for children. *What If the Wind Tears My Kite?* (2021) was her first picture book which she both authored and illustrated. It was shortlisted for the Hedwig Anuar Children's Book Award 2022.

Ashton Wu is a multi-disciplinary storyteller who is interested in understanding people and finding the best and simplest ways to communicate complex ideas. By day, he works as a marketing strategist for a youth start-up, and by night, he focuses on passion projects like writing children's books and creating comics. *Don't Call Me Cute!* is his first picture book.



Fan Haitao was a financial journalist at the *Beijing Youth Daily*, the Washington D.C. correspondent for Sina, and the China representative for U.S. News and World Report. In 2009, she co-wrote *Making a World of Difference*, the autobiography of the former CEO of Google China, Dr Lee Kai-fu, which has sold over a million copies. She was the first student from mainland China to earn a master's in oral history at Columbia University in 2013. After graduation, she set up her own studio dedicated to oral history interviewing and biography writing. She published her memoir, *Life Begins at Thirty*, in 2016, and has been invited by major Chinese universities to talk about non-fiction writing and oral history. She is currently the visiting professor at the Tianjin University of Sport's oral history research center.



Tham Cheng-E is the author of *Band Eight* and *Surrogate Protocol*, the latter shortlisted for the 2016 Epigram Books Fiction Prize. He is a father to two boys, the younger of whom has Down syndrome. He also writes about Down syndrome and parenting on his family blog *Thumbprints*.



Agnes Chew is the author of *The Desire for Elsewhere* (2016). Her writing has been published in Southeast Asia, the UK and the US. She holds a MSc in Development Management (Mayling Birney Prize for Best Overall Performance) from the London School of Economics and a double degree in Economics and Business (Magna Cum Laude) from Singapore Management University. With a keen interest in socioeconomic issues, she has worked in both public and nonprofit sectors. Born and raised in Singapore, Agnes has spent time in Vienna and London, and is currently based in Germany.

A.K. Zai is Zainon A Kadir. *Escape from Bussorah Street* is her first middle grade novel, losely based on real people and events. Her love for literature began in the 1970s at Crescent Girls' Secondary School, where she was taught by an amazingly eloquent teacher, Mrs Wong, to think critically when reading and writing. Since then, Zai has been writing poetry, drama scripts and short stories for competitions and for pleasure.



Better known as samarasketch, **Samara Gan** is a self-taught writer and artist from Singapore. She is an unapologetic fangirl who loves creating fan-art of her OTPs (one-true pairings) for her followers. She buries her inadequacy and insecurities under layers of humour and false bravado, and tries not to think too much about her more-than-likely future of dying alone. Her debut graphic novel, *How to Date a Dozen Men*, began as a four-page draft for a contest, and is based largely on her personal experiences in the dating scene.





Wong holds a PhD in literature and creative writing from UNSW Sydney.
