

Portable Cloth Hanger

Materials you'll need:

- 1/4" yard exterior fabric
- 1/4" yard lining fabric
- Fusible Weft Interfacing
- Spool of thread to match your fabric
- 3/4" wide Sew On Hook and Loop tape https://amzn.to/3sB4cun
- Clothes pins with space to insert strap https://amzn.to/3NalohS
- 1/4" double sided tape or fabric glue stick
- Turning tool of your choice
- Marking fabric pen or chalk
- Fabric scissors
- Wonder clips or any other clip you use to hold fabric together
- Iron and iron board or wool pad
- 6" x 18" quilting ruler

Seam Allowances

1/8" seam allowance for the straps & top stitching

1/4" seam allowance for the rest of the project

Measurements

Piece	Measurements	Exterior	Lining Contrasting	Interfacing

Hanging Straps	3" x 12"	1		

^{*}only 1 necessary if using waterproof canvas



Additional Materials Needed

Material	Measurement/Qty		
Small Clothespins (With space to insert straps)	6		
Sew On Hooks and Loops 3/4" wide	11 1/4" strip		

Instructions

- Iron all pieces to remove any wrinkles
- Apply interfacing to exterior and lining

Step 1 - Making the hanging straps.

- Take the piece of fabric that's 3" x 12" and cut it into 6 2" x 3" pieces
- Fold the small straps in half along the long edge, iron them.
- Fond them in half again, and iron them.
- Final size should be 3" x .5"
- Make six of these.
- Stitch along both sides of strap (3" side) using ½" seam allowance.
- Next, insert the finish stap through the clothes pin opening
- Fold the strap in half matching the top edges
- Place a small stitching in the middle of the strap to secure it in place and to prevent the clothes pins from sliding up

Step 2 - Placing the Markings

- Take the lining pieces
- On the right side of the lining piece choose one of the long edges
- On that long edge place 6 marking as follows:



- Markings from left to right
 - 1. 1.25
 - 2. 3.25
 - 3. 5.25
 - 4. 7.25
 - 5. 9.25
 - 6. 11.25

Step 3 - Attach The Straps

- Take the lining piece, right side up and the markings side facing up
- Take the finished straps and place them on each one of the markings
- * Important* The marking should be in the center of each strap
- Secure each strap using wonder clips
- The clothes pin should be laying on top of the right side of the lining piece facing to the other long edge of the lining piece.
- Stitch each strap in place using 1/8" seam allowance

Step 4 - Join Exterior and Lining

- Take the exterior piece and place on top of the lining piece, right sides together
- You're going to sandwich the clothes pins in between the exterior and lining piece
- Using wonder clips, join the exterior and interior matching all 4 sides
- Take it to the sewing machine and stitch all 4 sides using ¼" seam allowance, 3mm stitch length
- *Important* Make sure to leave a 5" opening on the long side that doesn't have the clothes pins.



- Trim the corners and turn it inside out
- Using a turning tool, push all 4 corners out
- Iron the piece so it's flat and nice
- On the opening side, fold 1/4" of both the exterior and lining fabric towards the inside of the piece
- Use a hot iron and press the fold
- Take it to the sewing machine and top stitch all around the piece using ½" seam allowance. At this point, you will be closing the opening as well

Step 5 - Attach the hook and loop tape

- Separate your hook and loop tape
- Take your hanger piece with lining side facing you
- On each long side mark a line all along the long edge, ¼" up from the edge
- Take the fabric glue stick and apply glue to the wrong side of the hook tape
- Place the hook side along the ¼" mark. Make sure it's centered.
 This is just my preference, but I like to place the hook tape on the side that doesn't have the hanging cloth pins
- Take the fabric glue stick, apply glue to the wrong side of the loop tape
- Place the look tape along the ¼" mark. Make sure it's centered.
- Take it to the sewing maching and stitch all 4 sides of the hoop and loop tape using \(^{1}\/_{8}\)" seam allowance, 3mm stitch length.
- Stitch along the hook and loop twice to make sure it's super secured
- Trim off any excess thread and your Portable Clothing Hanger is finished!!
