"We wanted all the luxuries of a holiday house but all of the functional details of a design-led home," says Melissa.

Working within the framework of an existing house due to budget, timing and planning considerations, the renovation of The Barefoot Bay Cottage was completed in eight weeks. To make the project financially self-sustainable, Melissa created an accommodation business, Barefoot Escapes.

"We wanted to capture the essence of the area and the connection to the lush hinterland and the beach," Melissa says. As a result, she used a palette of sage green, deep indigo and concrete grey.
