Thank you for choosing the Melissa & Doug Chef's Kitchen! It's a terrific way to help nourish a child's creativity and imagination, and to inspire budding chefs to hone their craft for years to come.

NOW IT'S TIME TO PUT IT TOGETHER!

Don't worry, assembling your new kitchen is simple, and we're here to help. It may go a little faster with a partner to lend a hand, but we've made it so one person can assemble the kitchen. Here are a few tips before you begin:

- Read through all the instructions first.
- Clear a flat, covered space (carpeted is best) to lay out all the materials so everything is close at hand.
- You will need a Phillips head screwdriver, slotted screwdriver, and wrench to assemble the kitchen.
- The instructions include lots of helpful pictures—we show you, step-by-step, exactly how to align pieces and parts for speedy and accurate assembly. Note that hardware needed for each step is shown in the upper right corner of the page, each piece being added in a given step is highlighted in gray, and the "assembled view" (what it looks like in the finished kitchen when the step is completed) is included in the lower right corner of every page.
- In the instructions, the name of a part is followed by a letter or number in parentheses. This letter or number corresponds to the sticker on the part, as well as the picture of the part shown on pages 2-4.
- Helpful hints are highlighted with a large exclamation point.

A WARNINGS!

Retain these instructions for future reference. Warning: Prevent Tip Overs!

- Do not allow children to pull, climb, sit, or stand on any part of the kitchen.
- Never place computers, televisions, or other heavy objects on top of the kitchen.
- The kitchen must be placed on a hard, flat, and level surface.
- If placing the kitchen next to a wall, we recommend applying the stabilizing strap.
- If placing the kitchen away from a wall, we recommend applying the stabilizing feet.

- The kitchen must be assembled as instructed.

MAINTENANCE:

Ensure the kitchen continues to function properly and safely by regularly checking the hardware and tightening when necessary.

Helpful Hints and Tips

- Note: Some packages of hardware may have extra pieces
- You will need a Phillips head screwdriver, slotted screwdriver, and wrench to assemble the kitchen.



IMPORTANT

Be smart—sort your parts! Be sure you have all required parts BEFORE beginning assembly!



DO NOT use power tools to assemble. Using power tools will cause product to crack!





To complete assembly, use hand-held screwdriver to fully tighten all screws until they're snug.

DO NOT OVER-TIGHTEN!

Over-tightening will cause product to crack!



STEP 2 - Divide and Conquer

Using 2 screws (part 1), attach the divider panel (part C) to the kitchen unit.

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STEP 5 - What's Left

Slide the left side panel (part F) into slot in the kitchen unit.



STEP 6 - Groovy

Slide the shelves (parts G & G2) into shelf grooves in the kitchen unit.





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STEP 7 - Get Back

Slide the bottom back panels (part H) into the grooves in the back of the kitchen unit.

STEP 8 - Get to the Bottom of It

Using 4 screws (part 1), attach the bottom panel (part I) to the bottom of the kitchen unit.

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STEP 11 - All About the Base

Carefully stand kitchen unit up. Using 2 screws (part 1), attach the kick plate panel (part J) to the base of the kitchen unit.





STEP 12 - Make a Splash

- Slide the side back panel (part K) into the grooves in the back of the kitchen unit.
- Lower the backsplash panel (part L) into the grooves in the back of the kitchen unit.

IMPORTANT: Make sure groove in

panel L is facing up.

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STEP 13 - Look: Hooks!

Hang the 3 hooks (part 9) onto the backsplash.

STEP 14 - Do It Your-Shelf







STEP 15 - Top Notch

Slide the top back panel (part N) into the groove in the back of the kitchen unit.

STEP 16 - Top It Off

Using 2 screws (part 1), attach the top panel (part P) to the kitchen unit.

STEP 17 - It's Great to Separate





Using 4 screws (part 1), attach the top panel (part P) to the sides of the kitchen unit.



STEP 19 - These Knobs Will Do the Job

- First, using 2 metal bracket screws (part 3), attach metal bracket (part 4) to the back of the oven control panel (part Q).
- Second, slide the oven knobs (part 10) through holes in the oven control panel (part Q). Press and screw oven knob nuts (part 11) firmly onto the back of the knobs.
- Third, insert the wooden dowel (part 12) into the top of oven control panel (part Q).

STEP 20 - Under Control

Using 4 screws (part 1), and 1 white screw (part 2), attach the oven control panel to the kitchen unit.

IMPORTANT: Screws go through long side of bracket.

STEP 23 - Easy to Handle

- Insert the 4 door handles (part 16) through the oven door, microwave door, refrigerator door, and freezer door (parts S, T, U & V).
- Slide the handle locks (part 17) onto the backs of the handles and push downward to lock.
- Insert 4 door latch springs (part 18) into the base of each door. NOTE: Insert the bottom peg first.

STEP 24 - Don't Come Unhinged

• First, using 2 metal bracket screws (part 3) in each, attach 6 hinge brackets (part 8) to the kitchen unit.



• Second, attach the doors (parts S, T, U & V) to the kitchen unit using the upper and lower spring hinges.



STEP 25 - Fire and Ice and Everything Nice

- Snap the burners (part 19) into the slots on the top of the kitchen counter.
- Snap the picture frame (part 20) and ice maker (part 21) into the slots on front of kitchen unit.





STEP 26 - Don't Leave Out the Spout

Insert the faucet (part 23) into the faucet hole and secure it with faucet screw (part 24) beneath the counter top.

STEP 27 - Three, Two, One–Done!

- Insert the kitchen clip (part 25) into the kitchen unit, and lock with the kitchen clip lock (part 26).
- Insert the sink (part 27) into the kitchen counter top.
- Insert the towel bar (part 28) into the side of the kitchen unit, and lock each end into place with the towel bar locks (part 29).







ATTACHING STABILIZER FEET (freestanding)

- If using the kitchen as a freestanding structure, then add stabilizer feet.
- Starting on the left side, use 2 bolts and 2 nuts (parts 7A & 7B) to attach a rear stabilizer foot (part 30) and a left front foot (part 31) to the kitchen.
- On the right side of the kitchen, use 2 bolts and 2 nuts (parts 7A & 8B) to attach a rear stabilizer foot (part 30) and a right front foot (part 31) to the kitchen.

ATTACHING STABILIZER STRAPS (against wall)

STEP 1

- 6 5 mm X1 32 5 mm X1 X1
- If placing the kitchen against the wall, then add the stabilizing strap (part 32).
- Insert the 15 mm kitchen screw (part 6) through a hole in the strap and screw into the top of the kitchen.



STEP 2

• This step is for drywall with a wood stud only! Locate the wall stud, then place the provided 38 mm wall screw (part 5) through the stabilizing strap hole and anchor it directly into the wood stud.



• For any other wall materials, contact your local hardware retailer for the best anchor method because different wall materials require different anchoring devices.



YOU DID IT!

Now the real fun begins—it's time to get cooking! Here are some of the special features of the Chef's Kitchen:

- Ice Maker with Ice Cubes: To load the ice cubes into the ice maker, open the refrigerator door and stack the cubes in the square opening on top of the dispenser. Close the door and gently press the dispenser handle—the cubes drop down one at a time!
- Generous Storage and Cooking Space: Keep lots of pretend food "chilled" in the two-level refrigerator and separate top freezer; a shelf in the oven gives extra room for "cooking" several dishes at once; store pantry items, cookware, and serving utensils on the shelf and under the sink.
- Hooks and Towel Bar: Neatly hang pots and pans, serving utensils, and oven mitts on the sliding hooks under the top shelf, and towels and aprons on the handy towel bar.
- Stove/Oven Dials Turn and Click: Dials are marked with pictures to indicate which burner each controls, just like on real stoves. Follow the arrows to turn the temperature from low to high and back again, and they make a satisfying clicking noise.
- Microwave with Turntable: Pretend to enter cooking time by pressing the numbers 0-9 on the microwave. Use the knob under the microwave to rotate the plate to "heat" food evenly. Door latches securely.
- Sink Handle Turns and Faucet Swivels: Pretend to adjust "hot" and "cold" water flow.
- Write-On Grocery List with Clip: To market, to market! Mark the grocery list with pencil and then erase to use over and over. Keep the list handy by clipping to the jumbo kitchen clip on the side of the fridge.
- Add Personalized Art: Use crayons, pencils, markers, or paint to color in the black and white picture and display in the frame on the refrigerator. Or, create and display original works of art!
