Music Appreciation Lesson

Review:

Ask your children if they can remember the name of the musical piece studied last week and anything about the reading of Handel's life.

Lesson Setup:

Today we will listen to the Hallelujah Chorus from Handel's *Messiah*. This piece was written in 1741 and is an English-language oratorio. Handel composed the entire 260 page long *Messiah* in just 24 days. In the reading, we hear about how Handel's career as an opera manager ended in failure and how he suffered a serious illness at the age of 52.

FUN FACT: Operas were complete dramatic works with costumes, actions and scenery, whereas oratorios were musical compositions for voices and orchestra without any of the costumes, actions or scenery.

Listen to the music:

Listen to the Hallelujah Chorus of *Messiah*, *HMV 56*. It is a 4 minute piece: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IUZEtVbJT5c

Reading & Narration:

Read aloud pages 50 to 53 of 'Chapter II: Handel' in *Studies of Great Composers*. Ask your children what they can tell you about today's musical piece and the reading. Make sure they can name the piece.

Afternoon Listening:

During the week while doing art, nature notebooking or handicrafts, listen to the <u>entire piece</u> of <u>music</u>. The whole of the *Messiah* is about 2 hours and 17 minutes long.
