Additional Resources

- ✓ A spiral-bound A5 or A4 sketch book of at least 60 pages, any page thickness (this will be your child's **Nature Notebook**)
- ✓ An A4 Nature Study book (one page lined, one page blank) of about 72 pages (this will be your child's **Science workbook**)
- ✓ **Magnifying glass**
- ✓ **Smartphone** or camera to take photographs
- ✓ **Pencil bag** with pencils, pens, fineliners, eraser, sharpener, scissors, glue and pencil crayons
- ✓ Several **clear plastic jars** with screw lids
- ✓ **Watercolour paper pad** of minimum 160gsm thickness, at least 35 sheets (paintings can be cut out and pasted in the Nature Notebook)
- ✓ Round watercolour **paintbrushes** (sizes 3, 6 and 8) and a flat watercolour paintbrush (1 inch or size 24)
- ✓ Good quality set of **watercolour paint tubes** of at least 12 colours.
- ✓ Plastic **paint mixer tray**
- ✓ A world **globe** and **atlas**
- ✓ Items for **experiments**: A bottle of sulfur, a bottle of iron filings, safety goggles, disposable latex gloves, table salt, a few glass tumblers or jars, mortar and pestle, a glass plate, a magnet, a bottle of sulphuric acid, a bottle of copper filings, a bottle of calcium oxide (quicklime), a small pan, a stove, some chalk crayons, a bottle of acetic acid (vinegar), a lamp, some clay or Prestik, a large piece of cardboard, a glass prism, a piece of wire, a few sheets of white card, a square inch of paper, some thread, a piece of leather, a flat stone, a kettle, a small heat source (e.g. a lit candle or lighter) and two books with smooth covers.
