Backstory: Across a range of internet sources, a writer named Guy Beringer is widely credited with introducing the word 'brunch', in his 1895 article in a London publication called Hunter's Weekly, about a late morning breakfast on Sundays. The writer used this new word to describe these meals quite well: "Brunch is cheerful, sociable and inciting. It is talk-compelling. It puts you in a good temper, it makes you satisfied with yourself and your fellow beings, it sweeps away the worries and cobwebs of the week."

- Q. What activity did brunch make popular, and socially acceptable?
- A. Day drinking!
