The Gaspésie of Animals! Preschool and Elementary School



In a scavenger hunt game, students try to find animals related to certain objects in the Where Worlds Meet exhibition. They learn that human history is closely linked to that of animals. This activity allows students to discover how people lived in the past, and how objects have evolved over time.

They'll need to put their historical knowledge and logical thinking to the test to succeed in their mission.

In the form of a shipping case, this educational kit travels the length and breadth of the Gaspé Peninsula. Inside, you'll find all the magic of this techno educational program. The case carries a computer, a projector and a motion sensor which, once activated, projects an interactive floor!
