Benji's Berry Berry Pie - Teaching Guide



Activity: Spelling Race Kitchen Edition

Overview

The teacher will have their students practice spelling kitchen vocabulary words.

Skills: Speaking/Listening

Time 5-10 minutes

Age: 5-10

Materials

Whiteboard or Large Paper Dry Erase Markers Markers

Instructions

- Two students go to the whiteboard
- The teacher says a word of an object that can be found in the kitchen
- The two students will be in a race to spell the word correctly





Activity: What Fruit Am I?

Overview

The teacher will write a bunch of fruits on a slip of paper. Then tape one to each students back so that they can't see what it is. The student has to go around to their classmates asking yes/no questions to find out what they are.

Skills: Speaking/Listening/Reading

Time: 10-15 minutes

Age: 8+

Materials

Tape

Vocabulary words on paper

Instructions

- The teacher prepares pieces of paper with the names of different fruits
- Students walk around the class asking one classmate one yes/no question. The classmate answers the question and after each question, they can have one guess as to what the secret thing is

The teacher tapes one paper to each student's back

 If incorrect, they talk to another classmate and follow the same procedure. If correct, they can take a break or get another paper from the teacher depending on time. A student can only ask one question to each student in the class- they cannot speak to the same student twice.
