



MACRAME CHRISTMAS TREE



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KNOTS YOU NEED TO KNOW (CLICK THE LINKS BELOW FOR TUTORIALS)

- [LARK'S HEAD KNOT](#)
- [VERTICAL KNOT](#)

WHAT IS NECESSARY

- ABOUT 22M OF 5MM MACRAME CORD IN BEIGE
- ABOUT 12,5M 5MM MACRAME CORD IN PINE GREEN
- ABOUT 9M 9MM MACRAME CORD IN NATURAL
- SHARP SCISSORS
- 2 HOOKS OR ANOTHER WORK SURFACE
- DOWEL
- BRUSH

HOW TO CUT THE CORDS

- 9 X 1M 9MM MACRAME CORD
- 20 X 1.10M 5MM MACRAME CORD IN BEIGE
- 9 X 1M 5MM MACRAME CORD IN PINE GREEN
- 7 X 50CM 5MM MACRAME CORD IN PINE GREEN



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Step 1

Begin working on your macrame Christmas tree by folding the 9mm cords in half. Then hang each string on a stick using a lark's head knot.



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Step 2

Using a Beige cord, tie the first vertical knot.

Each knot is made with 2 loops.

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Step 3

Made 2 rows of vertical knots using Beige cord. In the third row, make only the first four knots, as in the last photo.

Try to make each knot equally tight. This will keep your project straight.

Hold the macrame core (9mm cord) straight and vertical when weaving a pattern.

In next steps, we will start making a Christmas tree pattern. Hopefully, the diagram will be helpful.

To make the part of the tree marked with a **light green color**, use a 50 cm cord.

To make the **rest of the Christmas tree**, use a 1m long cord.



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Step 4

Let's start knotting a tree pattern. Take a look at the diagram on the previous slide. In the third row, make the fifth knot using 50 cm Pine Green cord, then finish the row with the same Beige cord. **Tutorial**

Repeat this step to create the fourth row.



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Step 5

Let's make rows 5 - 7. Take a look at the diagram if needed.

Be eco and don't waste the cords, in this step use 50cm long Pine Green cord. We don't need a longer one now ;)



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Step 6

We continue row 8-11.

Remember to use the same cord for the outermost knots next to the Christmas tree in Beige. Pull it over its back and knot it on the other side as well.



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Step 7

Start knotting the twelfth row.

Remember to make knots equally tight.



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Step 8

It's almost over :)

Make rows 12-16.



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Step 9

Let's add a trunk to our Christmas tree. Make the next two rows adding green knots in the middle.



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Step 10

The macrame Christmas tree is almost ready!

To complete the pattern, make two more rows of vertical knots using a Beige cord.

Right now it should look like in the picture above.



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Step 11

The pattern is now finished!

Cut the unnecessary cords hanging from the back of the macrame so that they cannot be seen.

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Step 12

Cut the fringe to a length of 20 cm.



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Step 13

Now let's brush it out to achieve perfect fringe.

Gently untie stings with your hands. This will make brushing easier.



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Step 14

Your fringe should look like in the picture above.



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Step 15

Congratulations, your Macrame Christmas Tree is done!
