What type of food was your pet eating prior to testing (i.e. kibble, raw, frozen, freeze dried, etc.)?

He was eating kibble with limited ingredient treats.

When we got the test results back, it was pretty easy to see that his food was what was causing the bumps around his legs. (he has longer hair so he very well could have had these bumps all over) We started by eliminating items that were in the red and yellow sections of his test so we could see how he does on his new diet.

What elimination plan did you implement (i.e. foods eliminated and/or changes in environment, timeframe, etc.)?

We decided to eliminate items on the red and yellow sections of his test. We did have to change his food, but he's thriving on his new food that has very few of his intolerances in it.

Describe condition of pet and/or symptoms after the elimination plan.

Finn's bumps have disappeared, and we do notice from time to time if we give him treats with ingredients he had on his list a few bumps pop up... but since we manage his intolerances now, the bumps seem to go away much faster than than they did before.
