Gilt Castle on Silver Star with scroll and Royal Anglian in text (note: currently in production).  All fastened by clutch and pin. Worn parallel with upper cut of V in lapel.	REGYPTA ANDRA
3	Tunic Buttons	Domed gold anodised button with raised 'Tiger' crest and Laurel Wreath.  There are four types of Regimental buttons:  a. Large Regimental Button. Gold anodised with raised 'Tiger' crest with laurel wreath. For wear on No 2 and No 4 dress (Design No 0 2704). 40 Ligne  b. Medium Regimental Button. Gold anodised with raised 'Tiger' crest with laurel wreath. For wear on No 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 Dress(Design No 0 2705). 30 Ligne  c. Small Regimental Button. Officers, mounted. Gold anodised with silver plated mounted 'Tiger' crest with laurel wreath. For wear on No 1 Dress Cap, Side Hat, No 10 Dress Jacket and Waistcoat and No 11 Dress Jacket  d. Small Regimental Button - O. Gold anodised with 'Tiger' crest and laurel wreath  e. Buttons are to be worn with the tiger horizontal. Epaulette buttons are to be worn with the tiger facing forwards.	

#### **Head Dress**

- a. No 1 Dress Cap. This is the normal parade headdress. It is worn with No.s 1, 2, 3, 6, 10 and 11 Dress except as where shown below. See Serial 16 for description.
- **b. Service Dress Cap.** RSMs may wear the Guards Barathea Service Dress Cap in No 13 and No 14 Dress (Barrack Dress).

#### c. Khaki Beret.

- (1) With black backing for badge 44mm across x 50mm deep, top edge domed. The cap badge is to be worn centrally on the backing.
- (2) The beret is to be worn with the Cap Badge above the left eye
- (3) Berets are to be pulled down on the right hand side only. The head band is to be worn 25mm above the eyebrows. Linings are not to be removed.
- (4) It is to be worn with No 8, 13 and 14 Dress, never with No 2 Dress.
- (5) It is not to be worn by officers when on parade with, or accompanied by, soldiers wearing No 1 Dress Caps.
- (6) In barracks offrs will wear the offr pattern beret and badge. On operations and field firing an OR pattern beret may be worn.

#### d. Side Cap.

- (1) All officers are to be in possession of a side cap with a midnight blue body piped gold, dark blue tip and flaps, scarlet peak in front and 2 small Regimental buttons as described in above. The Regimental cap badge is worn on the left side of hat.
- (2) It may be worn at the discretion of Commanding Officers as an optional headgear with No.s 1, 2, 4, 6, 10, 11, 13 and 14 Dress for minor parades, duties and events outside barracks when not on parade with soldiers wearing No 1 Dress caps.

#### e. Jungle Hat.

This may be worn in No 8 Dress as directed by CO.









	Tactical Recognition Flash (TRF)	These flashes are worn by all ranks on the right sleeve. The top of the TRF is to be 3 inches below the hem joining the sleeve to jacket. The TRF is worn in Combat Dress so No 7, No 8, and No 9 Dress. The Royal Anglian Dress Table also allows the TRF to be worn on No 2, No 4 and No 6 Dress.  1st Battalion. The Minden Flash. A cloth flash 35mm x 15mm woven with two equal parts coloured red and yellow. The red half is worn at the front.  2nd Battalion. The Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire flash. A cloth flash 35mm x 15mm woven in the sequence black, primrose, black.  3rd Battalion. The Royal Anglian Flash. A cloth flash 35mm x 15mm woven in the sequence blue, red, yellow, red, blue.  The 1st Battalion currently wears their TRF, the Minden flash on some other orders of Dress.  1st Battalion. Yellow cloth lanyard.

8	Eagle Sleeve Badge	Embroidered French Eagle on a purple cloth disc. Worn by all ranks on the left sleeve. The top of the badge is to be 2 inches below the hem joining the sleeve to the jacket.  Army Dress Regulations direct that the Eagle Arm badge is to be worn on No 2, No 3 No 4 and No 6 Dress.  (Note: A replacement bronze French Eagle has been approved by Council and by the Army Dress Committee. The old woven French Eagle will continue to be worn until the new bronze French Eagle is available).

10	Regimental Ties	The ties of the Royal Anglian Regiment, The 1st Bn and the 2nd Bn are pictured in that order. As is custom, the striping follows the upper right shoulder to the lower left hip, as would the shoulder belt of the Sam Browne. #### **Common Items**

#### Medals and Medal a. Medals are to be mounted court style. Ribbons b. Medals are worn with Nos 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 Dress when ordered - normally when swords are worn. c. Miniature medals will always be worn with Nos 10 and 11 Dress. d. Medal ribbons are worn with Nos 1, 2 and 4 Dress. Ribbons will be 10mm depth and placed centrally over the button of the left breast pocket. No ribbon should be fully hidden by the lapel of the coat. 102. 2006 Army Dress Regulations are below, and are correct in what should be worn, and of course will be updated to reflect that in future females will serve in the infantry and therefore in the Regiment:

Whilst it is unlikely that women will be commissioned into the regular elements of the Regiment, they may well hold a commission in the TA or Cadet Forces. Should such officers wish to wear No 10 Dress they will use the Regimental pattern of the Adjutant General's Corps for the ballgown and may wear the Regimental Mess jacket (scarlet with blue facing) as described above. However, the wearing of the jacket by non-regular commissioned officers in the Regiment is not mandatory because of the considerable expense involved'.

# Minden Roses and Remembrance Poppies

132		Red and yellow roses are worn behind the cap badge with the red to the right, or to the front when wearing side hat:  (a) On 1 August - Minden Day. By all ranks from Reveille to Last Post.  (b) On The Sovereign's Birthday. By all those on parade should there be a parade. Drums are to be decorated and colours wreathed.  (c) When The Sovereign is on Parade. e.g.: Coronation and Guards of Honour. Drums are to be decorated and colours wreathed.  (2) The 1st Battalion 'The Vikings' and the 2nd Battalion 'The Poachers' may play, in addition to the Regimental Marches, such marches of our former Regiments as Commanding Officers think fit.
133	Remembrance Poppies	The Poppies worn in the Remembrance period in November are not to be dismantled and is worn whole behind the Cap badge, as with Minden Roses, in the Beret and Side Hat. They are also to be worn in the left hand button hole of the No 1 Dress Hat.  Poppies to be worn on left breast of PCS in any order of Dress wearing the Beret as per ABN 141/15.

#### **Colonel of the Regiment and Deputy Colonels**

Dress for the Colonel Colonels may wear either: the General Staff uniform appropriate to their serving rank, or their rank on the day of their retirement; or the uniform of a Lieutenant Colonel of their regiment or corps with colonel's badges of rank but without gorget tabs. A combination of forms of dress is not to be worn. There is no additional entitlement beyond para 37.018 (direction to Colonels of Regiments), accoutrements or maintenance at public expense. Further details are covered in Army Dress Regulations para 02.295.
