

# ONTARIO NUC BOX

The Ontario Nuc Box is a lightweight and strong four and five frame nuc boxes made of 3 mm polypropylene (corrugated plastic similar to the winter beehive wraps) that is rain resistant when left in the bee yard. This box can also be used by beekeepers to make splits and catch swarms. A perforated lower front entrance can be cut open to allow the bees to come and go or taped closed to confine the bees for transportation.

There is a ¾" space above the frames to put pollen patties, fondant, or granulated sugar.

There are two ventilation holes, one at the front and back of the box. Bug screen (not included) can be taped, glued or stapled between the two full end pieces of the box. These flaps are tucked under the lid of the box when in use.

Inside the bottom of the box are frame restraints which keep the frames stable in their proper position.

This box is proudly made in Ontario of No. 5 plastic, so it can be recycled through the blue box program.

Order forms are available on the [ontariobee.com](http://ontariobee.com) website in early January. Order and payment are to be submitted before the middle of March.

The boxes will be available for pick up on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays in April.

The price will include a small profit which will be donated to the Ontario Beekeepers' Association's, Tech Transfer Team for bee research and training.
