



# **Building the Sides of the Sandpit**


You will need: 12 x Parts 1 (Sides) 6 x Parts 2 (Corner Posts) 48 x Screws 'A' (30mm)

Place one corner post upright, and attach two Parts 1 (sides) using four Screws 'A'. - one above the other (see

Screw in another part 1 to the corner post using another two Screws 'A'. to form one corner of the sandpit - then attach another above it as shown in the diagram 1a below.

Continue this using all six corner posts to create all six sides of the hexagon.

You do not need to tighten the screws all the way in at this stage, just screw them in enough to form and hold the structure of the sandpit.




# **Build the Seats of the Sandpit**

You will need: 6 x Parts 3 (Top Edges) 24 x Screws 'D' (35mm)

Lay all the top edges (parts 3) out flat on the top on the hexagonal sandpit frame. The edges of these should meet in the middle of the corner posts. Make sure these are properly lined up to form the hexagon before screwing them down.

Fix these in place using Screws 'D' and the guide holes provided (two at the end of each panel).








# **Securing the Corners**

You will need: 6 x Parts 5 (Corner Triangles) 12 x Screws 'B' (25mm)

Reinforce the corners of the sandpit using six parts 5 (Corner Triangles) and twelve Screws 'B'. Screw them to the underside of each corner where the two part 3's meet using the 25mm screws.





**Adding the Underlay** 

You will need: Part 6 (Underlay) 6 x Parts 4 (Side Batons) 12 x Screws 'C' (20mm)

Fix the sandpit underlay in place using the six Side Batons (parts 4) and twelve Screws 'C' (20mm).

You do this by laying the underlay inside the sandpit and screwing the batons (parts 4) to the inside of the sandpit with the underlay in between (see diagram 4).



#### The Finale

Now your sandpit is complete, you simply need to decide where you are going to place it. The sandpit should be placed on a suitable ground surface such as grass or a play mat.

We would now recommend you go round all the screws to make sure they are all tight as they can loosen slightly when you move the sandpit. Fill the sandpit with sand and it is now ready to use.

We recommend filling the sandpit with 6 to 8 x 25kg bags of play sand. It is important to use play sand as this is non-abrasive and other types of sand can hurt little hands.



# When the sandpit is not being used...

Don't forget to put the showerproof cover on when the sandpit is not being used. The cover will help to protect it and keep it looking good. There is a wooden cover for this sandpit which is available for purchase separately. An item with a height greater than the sandpit can be placed in the centre of the sandpit before the cover is placed on top. This will prop up the cover and allow water to run off and prevent "puddling" Should water accumulate and form a pool, please ensure this water is removed regularly as the water can pose a danger to children.

If your sand gets particularly wet, make sure you take the cover off on the first sunny day in Spring and allow your sand to dry out. You may want to replenish the play sand in your sandpit every year as it can get dirty and often gets thrown out through enthusiastic play! Placing the rain cover on after every use will help keep leaves, debris and cheeky little animals out of the sand!

# Looking After Your Sandpit

Your Hexagonal Sandpit is made of good quality fir wood. It has been treated to keep it looking good in your garden and to protect it from the elements. Despite this it should be covered in severe weather conditions. We recommend re-treating your sandpit regularly to prolong its life and keep it looking good too.

We would recommend a non-toxic wood stain - preferably tested to meet EN71 safety regulations (these are European children's play equipment safety rules).

#### Avoid products which contain ANY of the following:

antimony, arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, lead, mercury and selenium.

#### Wood is Natural - so we accept its quirks, naturally!

There will be a reason you have bought a wooden sandpit and not a plastic one. Like us, you are likely to appreciate the beauty and quality that a wooden product can give. They are also a little kinder on the environment than plastic products. As with all wooden products, some variation in colour may be apparent and the wood will expand and shrink in wet and dry conditions. As a result of this natural expanding and contracting some cracks and splits may occur which is normal and nothing to worry about - it just shows it is a natural product.

So please accept these quirks, and look after it - it deserves your care and attention!

## Weekly to monthly / routine visual inspection

Check wood for splinters which may occur - these could hurt little hands or become a choking hazard. Check for loose screws and fixings and tighten where and when necessary.

### 1 - 3 Months / operational inspection

Check the stability of the construction

## 1 - 2 times per year / annual inspection

Check for rust and corrosion of bolts and screws and replace where necessary.
