Building the Boat Base


You will need:

1 x Part 4 (Front Panel), 1 x Part 11 (Starboard Side) 2 x Parts 14 (Internal front & back panels)

1 x Part 13 (Port Side) 2 x Parts 12 (Side Top Panels)

1 x Part 15 (Rear Panel) 22 x Screws 'B'

Fix part 4 (front panel) to the side panels (parts 11 & 13) using four screws 'B' on each side (eight in total - entering at the side). Make sure the side panels are the right way round - with the single baton on the inner side towards the front and double baton at the back (see inset images). Repeat this with the rear panel (part 15) - using six Screws 'B' (three on each side - these screw in from the back not the side). Now slot the two internal front and back panels (parts 14) into place and fix with eight screws 'B' (two in each corner). Slot parts 12 into place (horizontally) - you will secure these later.



You will need: Assembled Structure from Step 1

1 x Part 7 (Main Mast)

1 x Part 8 (Horizontal Mast Top)

6 x Screws 'A'


2 x Parts 10 (Mast Supports)

1 x Part 18 (Rear Flag Pole)

4 x Bolts 'D'

Build the mast using parts 7 (main mast), 8 (horizontal mast top) and 10 (mast supports). Secure the mast supports to the main mast and horizontal top using two Screws 'A' on each side. Secure the main mast (part 7) to the horizontal top (part 8) using two more Screws 'A'. Place the completed mast in the gap between the front two panels as shown in the diagram and bolt into place with two Bolts 'D'. The bolts will be on the outside of the sandpit and the nuts on the inner panel. Then slot the flag pole part 18 between the two rear panels and bolt into place using two more Bolts 'D'.

At this stage ensure the two side panels (parts 12) are firmly in place (shown by the red arrows).





Completing the Main Boat Structure

You will need: Assembled Structure from Steps 1-2

1 x Part 5 (Front Top Panel)

1 x Part 16 (Rear Top Panel)

16 x Screws 'C'

Place the front top panel (part 5) in place on the front of the boat (around the bottom of the mast) and secure in place with five screws 'C'. Repeat with the rear top panel (part 16) slotting it around the flag pole and securing in place with a further five screws 'C'. Using six more screws 'C', fix the side top panels (parts 12) in place - these should already be slotted into place from step 1.



You will need:

Assembled Structure from Steps 1-3

1 x Part 1 (Starboard Bow Panel)

1 x Part 3 (Port Bow Panel)

1 x Part 20 (Steering Wheel)

9 x Screws 'B'

1 x Bolt 'E'

Attach the bow (front) panels parts 1 and 3 to the front of the boat as shown in diagram 4. Screw to the assembled structure from step 1-3 using six'B' screws.


Use a further three 'B' screws to fix the two pieces together at the very front.

Please note: part 1 has the baton at the edge - this is where part 1 and 3 join to make the pointed bow front.

Then fix the steering wheel onto the mast using one Bolt set 'E'.

Please note the bolt goes through the mast first, then centre of the wheel in this order: Bolt > Mast > Wheel > Washer > Nut > Cover

Creating the Seats

You will need: 2 x Parts 17 (Lid Seats) 12 x Screws 'C'

2 x Parts 2 (Bow Top Edges)

Fix the bow top edges (parts 2) on to the front of the boat (on top of parts 1 and 3) using four Screws 'C' - one at each end on both sides (see inset image).

Now attach the lid/seat sections (parts 17) using four more screws 'C' (two in each corner - see second inset image). Please note: the seats need to be placed so there is small gap in the middle of the two pieces when closed. This is to make sure it is easy to open and close them.



You will need:

1 x Part 9 (Sail Baton), 1 x Part 23 (Sail)

1 x Part 19 (Flag Pole Top)

1 x Part 6 (Bow Lid)

5 x Screws 'C'

Slot panel 6 onto the front of the boat as shown to form a cupboard for storage.

Using the long sail baton (part 23), fix the sail part 9 on to the horizontal mast top using four screws 'C'.

Fix the other end to the flag pole using part 19 (flag pole top) and one 'C' screw.




Completing the Sandpit

You will need:

1 x Part 24 (Sandpit Liner)

1 x Part 22 (Boat Ground Sheet)

Lay out the boat ground sheet (part 22) where you would like to keep the sandpit. The sandpit should be placed on a suitable flat ground surface such as grass or a play mat. Carefully place the sandpit on top. Insert the sandpit liner (part 24).





The Finale

Now your sandpit is complete, we would now recommend you go round all the screws to make sure they are all tight as they can loosen slightly when you move the sandpit.

Fill the sandpit with play sand and it is now ready to use. It is important to use play sand as this is non-abrasive and other types of sand can hurt little hands.

We recommend filling your sandpit to a depth of 10-15cm. For a 10cm depth you would need approx. 150kg of sand.



When the sandpit is not being used...

Don't forget to fold the wooden seats down when the sandpit is not being used. Use the full sandpit cover when you are not using the sandpit. Simply lay the cover over the sandpit and secure using the ties included. The waterproof sandpit cover will help to protect it and keep it looking good. The wooden seats/lid will stop debris and animals getting into the sand during short periods while not in use but we would recommend using the waterproof cover as often as possible to keep your sandpit looking the very best!

If your sand gets particularly wet, on the first sunny day in Spring remove the cover and allow your sand to dry out. You may want to replenish the play sand in your sandpit every year as it can get dirty and often gets thrown out through



Inspection & Maintenance

We recommend the following inspection and maintenance.



Looking After Your Sandpit

Your Sand Sailer[®] Sandpit is made of good quality fir wood. It has been treated to keep it looking good in your garden and to protect it from the elements. Despite this it should be covered in severe weather conditions. We recommend re-treating your sandpit regularly to prolong its life and keep it looking good too.

We would recommend a non-toxic wood stain - preferably tested to meet EN71 safety regulations (these are European children's play equipment safety rules).

Avoid products which contain ANY of the following:

antimony, arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, lead, mercury and selenium.

Wood is Natural - so we accept its quirks, naturally!

There will be a reason you have bought a wooden sandpit and not a plastic one. Like us, you are likely to appreciate the beauty and quality that a wooden product can give. They are also a little kinder on the environment than plastic products. As with all wooden products, some variation in colour may be apparent and the wood will expand and shrink in wet and dry conditions. As a result of this natural expanding and contracting some cracks and splits may occur which is normal and nothing to worry about - it just shows it is a natural product.

So please accept these quirks, and look after it - it deserves your care and attention!

Weekly to monthly / routine visual inspection

Check wood for splinters which may occur - these could hurt little hands or become a choking hazard.

Check for loose screws and fixings and tighten where and when necessary.

1 - 3 Months / operational inspection

Check the stability of the construction

1 - 2 times per year / annual inspection

Check for rust and corrosion of bolts and screws and replace where necessary.


