YOU MUST PLAY YOUR PART

What To Do If An Incident Occurs

An incident could be:

- Man Down
- Fall
- Fire
- Other Dangerous occurrence

As a Road Crew member take **IMMEDIATE** and appropriate action which may require you to stop your entry or the Carnival Procession itself.

1. Road crew member shall then report the incident to the club road captain
2. Road captain takes **any further** immediate necessary action
3. Road captain relays situation to marshals if appropriate (emergency services if occurrence is not during procession)
4. Marshals summon emergency services as necessary
5. Road captain reports to Club Chairman or other senior officer.
6. Club Chairman deals with the aftermath of situation either internally by putting appropriate procedures in place to further prevent a reoccurrence of the incident, or / and externally by liaising with public bodies such as Police and HSE.
