

BRAIDED CABLE INSTALLATION



Cutting braided stainless cable housing can result in the end looking like a flower arrangement.

A simple way to avoid this is to tightly wrap the area to be cut with duct tape. Masking tape, electrical tape, or medical (white) tape will also work. Clamp the housing in a vice and use a fine tooth (32T) hacksaw.

A sharp chisel and block of aluminum or hardwood also works, but you will have to round out the flattened end.

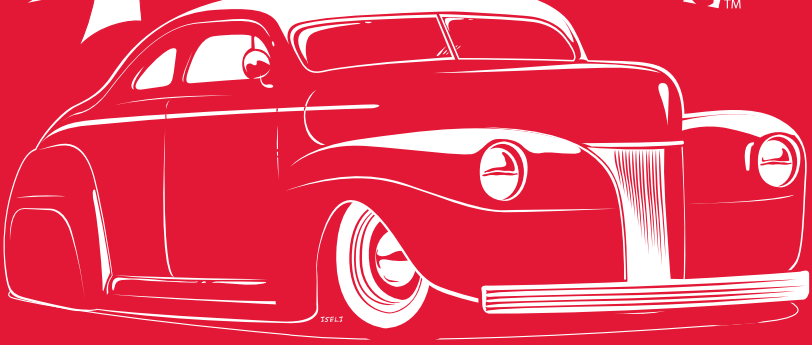
The machined housing ends are made oversize to accommodate some end flare-out. If the flare-out is too extreme, a sanding belt can be used to chamfer the end somewhat.
