Toluene

Why am I being warned about potential exposure to toluene?



- Toluene is on the <u>Proposition 65</u> list because it can cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. Significant exposure to toluene during pregnancy may affect the baby's development.
- Proposition 65 requires businesses to determine if they must provide a warning about significant exposure to <u>listed chemicals</u>.

What is toluene?

Toluene is a solvent used to make some paint thinners, adhesives, and nail care products. It is also added to gasoline to improve its octane rating.

How does exposure to toluene occur?

- Products that contain toluene can release the chemical into the air, where it can be inhaled.
- Occasional use of these products, for example, when doing household projects, or visiting a nail salon, does not typically result in significant exposure to toluene.
- Toluene may be deliberately inhaled from some products for its mood-altering effects. This is often referred to as "glue sniffing," and is a highly addictive and dangerous form of substance abuse.
- Smoking a <u>hookah</u> (also known as a waterpipe, shisha, or narghile) can expose you and those around you to toluene.
- During pregnancy, toluene can pass from mother to baby.

How can I reduce my exposure to toluene?

- ✓ When using products that may contain toluene, always follow the manufacturer's instructions and safety precautions on the product label.
- ✓ Make sure there is adequate ventilation in the workplace or other area where you use products that may contain toluene.
- On not use hookahs or spend time in places where hookah smoking occurs.
- Do not deliberately sniff glue or other products that contain solvents like toluene. Keep these products away from children. To prevent <u>substance abuse</u>, monitor use of these products by teens.
