

Why Marker?

A conversation with Anita Frederick, EdS, Lead School Psychologist at Hall County Schools



 Hall County partnered with Marker Learning in the Spring of 2022.

Prior to that partnership, they recognized that their school psychologists were already underwater, and anticipated that post-covid, they could expect a minimum of a 10% increase in caseloads. They then had two full time school psychologists resign. They needed school psychologists, but the pipeline in Georgia was not there, and the local contractors were just as swamped as their inhouse staff.

That is what led Hall County to Marker Learning. Since that initial partnership, Hall County has completed 30 successful remote evaluations with Marker Learning, with every intention to continue. **Continue on to read their story.**

Before Marker Learning, what challenges were your department facing?

“Following Covid, our team found that academic and behavioral challenges were increasing throughout the district, and that the number of parent requests for evaluations was increasing as well. We still had the same number of psychologists, less actually, and yet our caseloads were steadily increasing.

There was no pipeline of school psychologists for hire to choose from, and the contracted psychologists we had used locally in the past were equally swamped and next to impossible to schedule.”
