Safety Information

WARNING: To reduce risk of injury and property damage, you must read this entire guide before assembling, installing, and operating this filtration system.

- This RO water filtration system is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- This RO water filtration system requires a dedicated 3-prong outlet. If you do not have one, consult a professional electrician to have one installed.
- DO NOT use system if power cord is damaged. Contact customer service immediately for a replacement. When unplugging power cord ALWAYS grasp plug firmly to remove. DO NOT pull on power cord itself as this may cause damage or electrical shock.
- DO NOT expose filtration system to direct sunlight as this may cause damage.
- DO NOT store or expose system to temperatures lower than 32°F (0°C).
- DO NOT install filtration system near heat sources, open flames, or combustible substances.
- DO NOT place magnetic devices near system as damage could occur.
- DO NOT place heavy objects on top of system.
- DO NOT allow children near system without adult supervision.

Intended Use

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

- Staff kitchen areas in shops, offices, and other working environments
- Farm houses
- Hotels, motels, and other residential-type environments
- Bed-and-breakfast environments
- Catering and similar non-retail applications

2. Connect to the Cold Water Supply

CAUTION: DO NOT CONNECT THIS WATER LINE TO A HOT WATER SUPPLY LINE. The water supply to the unit MUST be from the COLD WATER LINE. Using HOT WATER will severely damage your filters.

- A. Turn off cold water supply. Open faucet and drain any remaining water in pipes.
- **B.** Using an adjustable wrench, disconnect cold water pipe from cold water supply line.
- C. If necessary, remove old or deteriorated threadsealing tape from male threading on cold water supply line, then use a clean cloth to wipe away remaining debris or water.
- D. Place the end of the thread-sealing tape (M) on the male threading on the cold water supply line. Hold it in place with your thumb. The tape should lie flat over the threads and extend out perpendicularly from the cold water supply linen. Wrap the tape clockwise around the threading. Hold tape taut so that it wraps snuggly. Wrap 4 to 6 times, overlapping as you go. When done, tear the tape sharply, using your thumb and forefinger.
- E. Repeat the tape-sealing process on the malethreaded end (top) of the feedwater adapter (J).
- F. Twist feedwater adapter onto cold water supply line, then attach cold water pipe to the top of the feedwater adapter.
 - **NOTE:** In the event the cold water pipe has a 3/8-in. diameter, a 3/8-in. adapter nut is attached to the base of the feedwater adapter. Unscrew from base and twist on to top.
- G. The system must be used within indicated water pressure range. If your water pressure is high, a pressure reduction valve (I) has been included with the system. Install it on the 1/4-inch shut-off valve tube (R) after the feedwater adapter and before the shut-of valve on the tube. Use the tube cutter (N) to cleanly cut tubing. Install valve so that it aligns with the flow of water.
- H. Insert the shut-off valve tube (R) straight into the quick connect at the end of the feedwater adapter (J). Insert to the black line marked on the tube.
- I. Gently tug on the shut-off valve tube to ensure a secure connection with the feedwater adapter.
 - *IMPORTANT:* To remove tubing, ALWAYS press the gray collar on the fitting first to release. DO NOT attempt to remove tubing by pulling on it without first releasing it. This may damage tubing and cause leakage.









3. Connect the RO Wastewater Tube

The drain saddle (K) is designed to fit around a standard 1.5 in. OD (outer diameter) drain pipe.



Always install the drain saddle before the P-trap and on a straight vertical or horizontal section of the pipe.



To avoid clogging the drain line with debris, do not install the drain saddle after the drain pipe meets a garbage disposal or dishwasher drain.



To make the wastewater drain connection:

- A. Determine location for drain saddle. To guide drilling, make a mark on the pipe for opening (1).
- **B.** Using adjustable drill with 1/4" drill bit, drill hole at mark. Drill hole in one side of pipe ONLY.
- C. Remove the backing from the foam gasket. Align the adhesive side of it over the hole on the inside of the drain saddle (K). Press in place, ensuring a clean opening.
- D. Position both halves of the drain saddle around the drain pipe, aligning the opening in the drain saddle directly over the drilled hole in the drain pipe. Insert the drill bit through both holes to ensure proper alignment.
- E. Secure the drain saddle to the drain pipe using the provided nuts and bolts. DO NOT overtighten.
- F. Insert the wastewater tube (S) into the quick connect of the drain saddle. Insert to the black line marked on the tube. Gently tug on the tube to ensure a secure connection.



4. Install the Smart Faucet

- A. Ensure that you have a faucet mounting hole in your sink or sink countertop for this faucet. If you do not, create a mounting hole no less than 1 1.2 in. (26 30 mm).
- **B.** Remove the washer (1) and lock nut (2) from the faucet. Ensure that you leave the O-ring (3) on the faucet. It nestles securely into a groove at the base of the faucet.
- C. Attach one 1/4 in. quick connect (H) to the ends of each of the faucet stems.



- D. Thread the faucet power cord through the mounting hole in the countertop. Insert the faucet into the mounting hole. Secure in place under the sink with the washer, followed by the locking nut.
- E. From underneath the sink, insert the white filtered water tube (Q) into the 1/4-in. quick connect on the shorter faucet stem. Insert the blue purified water tube (Q) into the 1/4-in. quick connect on the longer faucet stem. Slide a lock clip beneath each gray collar on quick connects to secure tubing in place.



5. Complete the Installation

- IMPORTANT: The filtration system has been fitted with protective plugs to ensure system ports are not damaged during shipping. Plugs MUST BE removed before connecting tubing. To remove plugs, slide release tool of tube cutter (N) around the base of the plug and over top of gray collar. Press down on gray collar to release the plug. DO NOT attempt to remove plugs by pulling them up without first releasing them. This may severely damage ports and cause water leakage.
- A. Connect the shut-off valve tube (R) to inlet water port (11).
- B. Connect white faucet tube (Q) to filtered water port (10).
- C. Connect blue faucet tube (Q) to the purified water port (9).
- D. Connect wastewater tube (S) to wastewater port (8).
- E. Slide one lock clip under each gray collar to ensure secure tube-port connections.

<u>Operation</u>

Start Up the Filtration System

- A. Ensure all water connections are completed as described in the Installation section.
- **B.** Turn the cold water supply on. Ensure the shut-off valve is open on the shut-off valve tube (R).
- C. Connect the smart faucet power cord to the smart faucet power cord connection (7), then attach the power cord with adapter to the system power cord connection (6). Plug the power cord with adapter into a 3-prong outlet.
- D. The system will beep once, and the filter indicator panel and the smart faucet LED screen will turn on. The system will go into an automatic flushing mode, which lasts approximately 90 seconds.
- E. Rotate the smart faucet's RO handle (2) open. Allow the purified (RO) water to dispense for 5 to 6 minutes or until water runs clear. Do not drink this water. While system is flushing, ensure there are no system leaks.
- F. The system is now ready to dispense filtered and purified water.
 - **NOTE:** If the faucet dispenses water for more than 30 minutes, uninterrupted, the water filtration system enters overtime protection mode. The LED display screen flashes, and the filtration system is no longer able to produce water. To clear protection mode, close the handles on the smart faucet and unplug the water filtration system. Wait a few seconds, then plug it in.









Shutting Down the Water Filtration System

If the system will not be used for an extended period of time, turn off the shut-off valve on the shut-off valve tube (R) and unplug the water filtration system.

When the system is turned on again, it will go into automatic flushing mode to clear the filters.

Care and Maintenance

- Keep the system in a cool, dry place away from direct sunshine.
- Use a clean, soft cloth to remove dust buildup. DO NOT use soap, detergent, or harsh abrasives.
- If the filtration system is not going to be used for an extended period of time, close the shut-off valve on the shut-off valve tube (R) and unplug the filtration system.
- Never lay the water filtration system on its side or back. It should always be operated and stored in an upright position.
- If the cold water inlet temperature drops to 32°F (0°C), there is a risk the tubes could crack, and damaging leaking could occur. To prevent this, turn off the shut-off valve on the shut-off valve tube (R), then open the handles of the smart faucet and drain any remaining water out of the filtration system.

Filter Replacement Schedule

Filter Type	Model No.	Replacement Schedule	Function
PCB	RPFROSL500PCB	6–12 months or 3,600 liters	Removes mud, sand, rust, and other suspended solids; also removes chlorine, and unpleasant tastes, odors, and colors.
RO	RPFROSL500RO	12–24 months or 7,200 liters	Membrane rated at 0.0001 µ. Removes up to 99% of contaminants, including total dissolved solids, fluoride, and heavy metals like lead and arsenic.

Replace Filters

When one or both of your filter indicator lights begin to flash, the filter(s) need to be replaced. To change filter:

- A. Unplug unit from power source, then turn off water supply. Open faucets and drain remaining water in system. Remove compartment cover of filter to be replaced.
- B. Grasp handle of expired filter and rotate counterclockwise to unlock from compartment. If you encounter resistance, use filter release tool (L). Once expired filter has been unlocked, remove from compartment.



- **C.** Insert new filter, rotating clockwise to lock into place. Filter handle should align with dot on RO filter system as shown in the below illustration. Reinstall compartment cover.
- D. Turn on water supply, then plug unit back into power source. Press and hold the reset button until filter indicator light stops flashing (approximately 3 seconds). Proceed to "Flushing the Filters" section.

Flushing the Filters

Always flush new filters before using. Open faucet. Press the flush button once. The flushing process takes approximately 60 seconds. To stop the flushing process at any time, press the flush button again.

NOTE: The flush button does not work when the system is in an automatic flushing mode.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Probable cause	Solution
The filters are generating a light noise during operation.	The filters will generate a light noise during operation.	This is normal.
The water output volume has dropped.	 The filter is jammed. The filter needs to be replaced. The shut-off valve is not in the ON position. 	 Flush or replace the filter. Replace the filter. Check the shut-off valve and the faucet handles to ensure they are in the ON position.
The water quality is low.	 The filter needs to be replaced. The filtration system has not used for a long period of time (over 3 days). The quality of the source water is low. The ambient operating temperature is too low. 	 Replace the filter. Rotate the RO handle open and flush the system for 3-5 minutes. Confirm that the water source is municipal tap water. Increase ambient temperature.
There is water leakage.	A component is damaged.	Immediately turn off water and power to the system, and contact customer service for assistance.
There is no water output after replacing a filter.	There is an air jam.	When replacing a filter, first unplug the water filtration system, then shut off the water supply. Replace the filter. Turn the water supply back on, then plug the water filtration back in.

<u>Warranty</u>

Brio ("Vendor") warrants to the original purchaser of the Brio Water Filtration System (the "Product"), and to no other person, that if the Product is assembled and operated in accordance with the printed instructions accompanying it, then for a period of one (1) year from the date of purchase, all parts in the Product shall be free from defects in material and workmanship. This Limited Warranty shall be limited to repair or replacement of parts, which prove defective under normal use and service and which Vendor shall determine in its reasonable discretion upon examination to be defective. To take advantage of this Limited Warranty, please follow these steps:

- 1. Please retain your sales slip or invoice, as Vendor may require reasonable proof of your date of purchase.
- 2. Contact Vendor's Customer Service Department using the contact information listed below.
- 3. Return parts to Vendor, per Vendor's instructions, at your cost and expense.
- 4. Upon receipt by Vendor, Vendor shall advise you in writing whether a defect covered by this Limited Warranty exists in any returned part and whether your claim has been approved or denied.
- 5. Upon Vendor's approval of your claim, Vendor will replace such defective part without charge to you.

WHAT THIS LIMITED WARRANTY DOES NOT COVER: This Limited Warranty does not cover any failures or operating difficulties of the Product due to accident, abuse, misuse, alteration, misapplication, improper installation or improper maintenance or service by you or any third party, or failure to perform normal and routine maintenance on the Product, as set out in the User's Manual.
