

ANATOMY OF A ROOM

FRENCH-BROOKS INTERIORS

Victoria Wormsley, founder of French-Brooks Interiors, and her team brought warmth to this once tired house in Notting Hill. 'The owners met in Russia, where they had collected art from the Soviet period,' says Victoria. They had also inherited some interesting furniture, which needed to be woven into the designs: 'We were aiming for a calm feel, but with character and interest. The owners' artworks were the starting point for this sitting room, grounded by the green flatweave carpet, which resonates with the paintings without competing with them. The sofa, upholstered in a blue velvet from Romo, and the cushions in a Josef Frank fabric add to the eclectic effect. As Victoria explains, the 1950s chandelier turned out to be Czech rather than Italian, so it fitted in perfectly with pieces from Sweden and Eastern Europe, reflecting the owners' interests. french-brooks.com | thelist.houseandwarden.com








Take a seat: dining chairs
