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## **BEFORE YOU START**

- WOF = Width of fabric. All pattern measurements assume Check cottonandjoy.com/pattern-corrections for any
- Seam Allowance = 1/4"

- hashtag #cottonandjoypatterns

MATERIALS	REQUIREMENT	CUTTING
BACKGROUND	1½ yards	1 2" x WOF, subcut: <b>A: 20</b> 2" x 2"
		<b>4</b> 5¼" x WOF, subcut: <b>40</b> Template C
		1 9½" x WOF, subcut: B: 5 9½" x 4½" C: 5 9½" x 2½"
		<b>3</b> 2½" x WOF, subcut: <b>D: 6</b> 20" x 2½"
ORANGES	(x4) ¼ yard <b>or</b> 20 5" squares	From each ¼ yard cut <b>5</b> Template A for a total of 20.
LEAVES	(x2) ¼ yard <b>or</b> 10 5" squares	From each ¼ yard cut <b>5</b> Template B for a total of 10.
BACKING	1⅔yards	
BINDING	⅓ yard	<b>4</b> 2½" x WOF

This pattern was written to work with the Modern Curves rulers.

## **SEWING INSTRUCTIONS**


## **QUARTER CIRCLE UNIT**


- Folding along the curve, match ends, and press the fold to crease all Template A pieces and half of the Template C pieces. Fig 1
- Place a Template A piece right sides together with a Template C piece, lining up edges as shown in Fig 2. If needed, pin at the crease and ends.
- Slowly sew around the curve, keeping the sewing machine needle down and slowly adjusting the fabric so that the curved edges and creases line up. Fig 3. Press seam towards Template C piece.
- 4. Trim Unit to 5" square, making sure to leave a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance as seen in **Fig 4**.
- 5. Repeat steps 1-4 with all Template A pieces.


#### **ORANGE PEEL UNIT**


- Folding along the curve, match ends, and press the fold to crease all Template B pieces and remaining Template C pieces. Fig 5
- Place a Template C piece right sides together with a Templace B piece, lining up edges as shown in Fig 6. If needed, pin at the crease and ends.
- Slowly sew around the curve, keeping the sewing machine needle down and slowly adjusting the fabric so that the curved edges and creases line up. Fig 7.
  Press seam towards Templace C piece.
- 4. Trim excess on Template C, making sure to leave a ¼" seam allowance in the corners. **Fig 8**
- Repeat steps 1-3 on the side opposite of Template C.Fig 9
- 6. Trim Orange Peel Unit to 5" square, making sure to leave a 1/4" seam allowance in the corners. **Fig 10**
- 7. Repeat steps 1-6 with remaining Template C pieces.




#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

- Mark a diagonal line, from corner to corner, on the wrong side of four A squares. Fig 11
- Place one A square, right sides together, on a corner of one Quarter Circle unit, as seen in Fig 12. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim corner leaving ¼" seam allowance and discard excess. Fig 13. Press seam.
- Repeat steps 1-2 on three more Quarter Circle units. Fig 14
- 4. Sew four Quarter Circle units, rotating them so the A triangles meet in the middle. **Fig 15**
- Sew two Orange Peel units together, so their points meet in the middle. Fig 16
- 6. Sew units from step 4 and 5 together. **Fig 17**. Press seam. Block should measure  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $13\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 7. Repeat steps 1-6 until you have a total of 5 blocks.


### TABLE RUNNER ASSEMBLY


#### Refer to Fig 18 for all steps in this section.

- Sew one B piece each to the bottom of each block, then sew one C piece each to the top of each block. Press seams towards C and B pieces.
- 2. Layout the five blocks, rotating two of them upsidedown, and add D strips strips in between blocks. Press seams towards D strips.
- 3. Sew remaining D strips to the left and right sides of the quilt top. Press seams towards D strips.


