Countless women lost spouses and their sole earning members to Covid pandemic. Their trauma is not just physical or emotional, they are facing financial uncertainties.

Outcome

Help many covid impacted women from starvation, making sure their health and well-being are not compromised. Through various programs, women will be able to get jobs/self employed and support their children and other dependents.

Conduct life-skills workshops on multiple aspects along the lines of social, personality and career orientation and build confidence in women from economically weaker & vulnerable families.

Empower women by helping them find livelihood, educate their children and improve their sense of well being.

Placement Support: Placements arranged regularly and efforts will be made to build a network of relevant and potential employers for placing women. Women will be supported through various workshops to prepare themselves for interviews through mock interviews, workplace readiness etc.

Follow up sessions with women beneficiaries for upto 3 months post program completion





Key Statistics of Ongoing Trainings PAN India



PLAN AHEAD - SHE-CAF Phase 2



- SHE-CAF Phase 2 planned start Date: April 30,2022
- Total Beneficiaries: 3000 pan India Program Duration: 30 – 36 months
- Proposed Program Outreach: 15 states or more
- Target Beneficiaries: Covid impacted women from Urban, Rural & Tribal areas, Transgender community, Migrant workers
- Proposed programs: Regional skill development(kalamkari art, puppets, dolls, crochet, apiculture, aquaculture medicinal plants etc), weaver empowerment, microenterprise, livestock rearing, skill development trainings(computer, beauty, tailoring etc), tribal livelihood

SANITATION PROJECT

Area of work: Murgod, Belgaum, india

We are working with Government higher primary school murgod in bailahongala, belgaum district.

This school was built during the british ruling period and was used as jail to lock up our freedom fighters, later it was converted into a govt school by the karnataka state government. The toilet blocks built were not in a good condition and sewa is repairing these unit by recreating the sanitary pipelines and the septic tank. We also realised that the blocks were damaged by the localities. To avoid this sewa is constructing new gates and grills, where outsiders cannot use it during the non-school hours.

area of work: kanpur,uttarpradesh,india

Our sewa team has identified few schools around Ghatampur region in kanpur, Uttarpradesh.

These schools are in very remote place and the nearby villages gets flooded everytime when they open the Dam gates, since it is on the banks of yamuna river.

Government around these areas serve the villagers as their shelter homes until the flood is receded.

Jayanth bhatt from SHE team visited these schools for a survey and construction/repairs of toilets will be starting soon.
