SHE-CAF FUR TRANSGENDER COMMUNITY

Sewa International's SHE-CAF launched a training program in Bangalore for 20 transgender people.

The program focusses on setting up garlic peeling machines, These machines have been procured and we are currently training our beneficiaries on the usage of these peeling machines. The program is also providing market linkages with grocery outlets and metros across the city for the sales of peeled garlic cloves.

Smt Jayanthi Ramanan joined Sewa International's Cleveland Chapter in 2010. She has tutored African American and Hispanic adults and children, and worked in a variety of community programs in the USA with education being the key focus of her service. She moved to Bharat in 2013 to look for suitable projects to get involved through Sewa international.

After starting many initiatives in Bharat, from slum development to Kutch to Kashi and more, Jayanthi Ji started the SHE program in 2015, which has developed significantly over the years and has impacted the lives of thousands of girls and their families. During COVID, this program transformed into SHE-CAF and is helping hundreds of women in many states of the country to earn their livelihood after the COVID devastated their families.

The journey that started with a desire to serve in Bharat for 6 months, resulted 3 years of long stay in her first stint, fighting through multiple challenges and building the service program, at times against all odds and not cowing down even by threat on her life, while working in slums to educate children and help in raising the living standards there. Over the years, she has been spending significant amounts of time traveling across length and breadth of the country, in helping in growing this program, and transforming the lives of thousands of girls and their families.

Under her leadership, the SHE project has done extraordinary work in Bharat.

Jayanthi ji is taking the advisory role as Mentor for this program, leaving the execution of the program in the hands of a strong and able team in Bharat in guidance of the SHE-Toli here in the USA. Her focus will now mainly be in the USA to generate awareness and support for this program and help the team in the USA to grow this program.

We are very grateful for her extraordinary contribution to the growth and success of the SHE program. Our best wishes to Jayanthi Ji as she will continue to evolve and nurture new initiatives along with her role as mentor for the SHE program.
