- **Proposed programs:** Regional skill development (kalamkari art, puppets, dolls, crochet, apiculture, aquaculture, Arni work, medicinal plants etc), weaver empowerment, microenterprise, livestock rearing, skill development trainings (computer, beauty, tailoring, yoga/fitness instructor, tally etc), tribal livelihood, Agri farming etc.

- Organized volunteer programs amongst beneficiaries to instill *Sewa Manobhavana* and build a community network

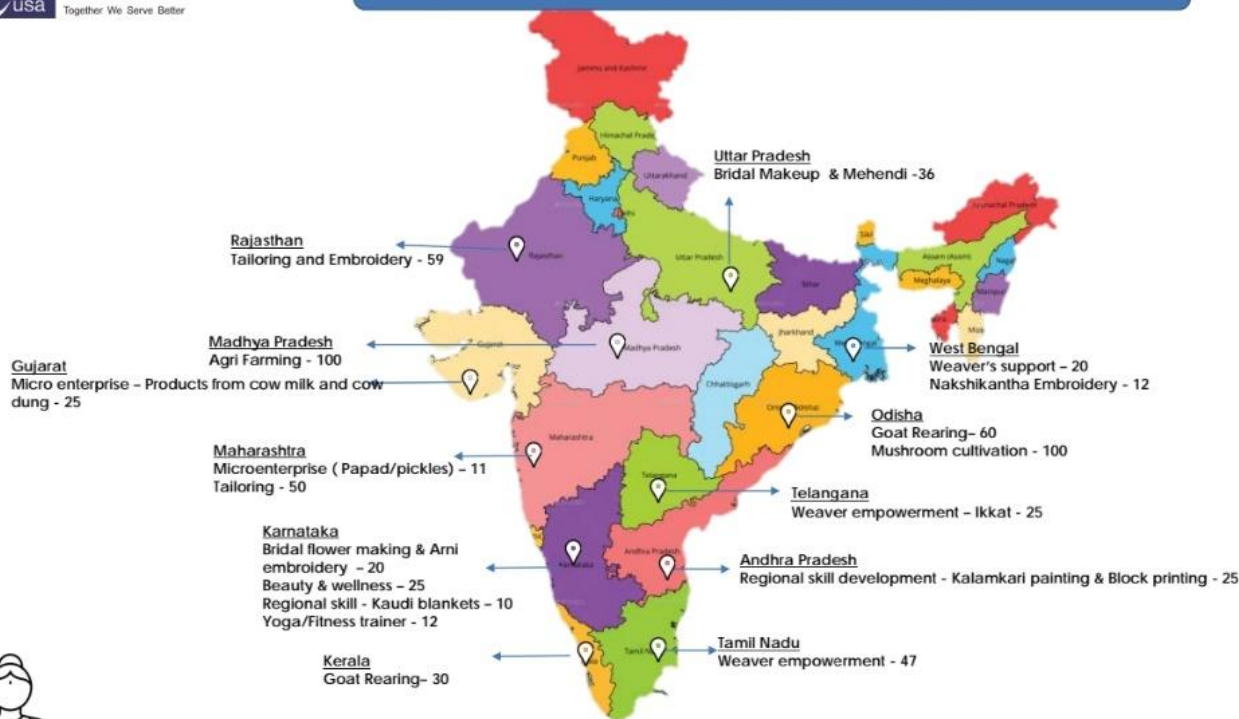

- Planning exhibitions to display/sell products made by our CAF beneficiaries.

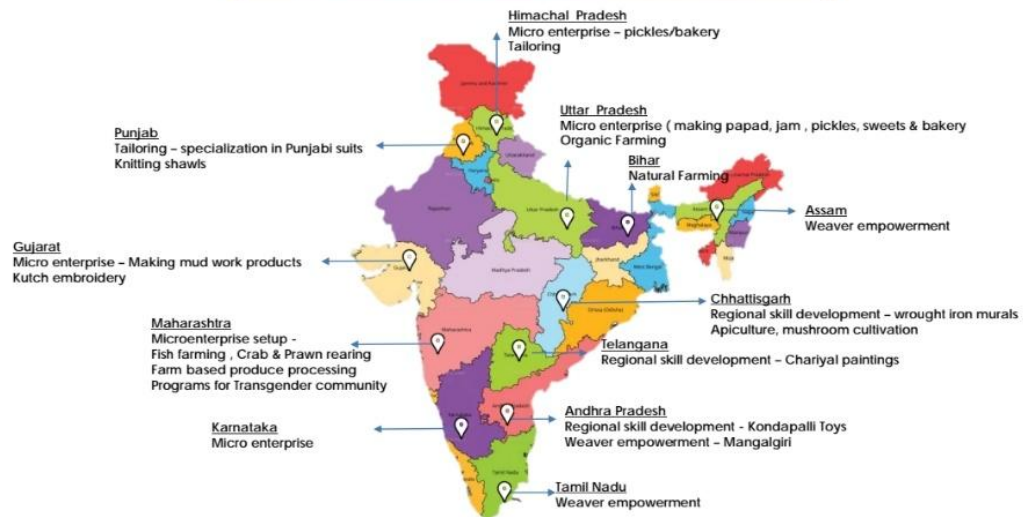

## Area of work: Viratnagar, Rajasthan, India

Sewa SHE team has been actively working in viratnagar, Jaipur region on livelihood project for COVID impacted women. We have also come across 5 government schools which are in acute need for sanitation around this area.

Sewa is working with these schools in building them free toilets and has also reached out to the Basic shiksha Adhikari (BSA) seeking NOC for the construction.

Plan is to conduct yoga, self defense and menstrual hygiene awareness camp for the girls.

Construction will be starting at the earliest in these schools.

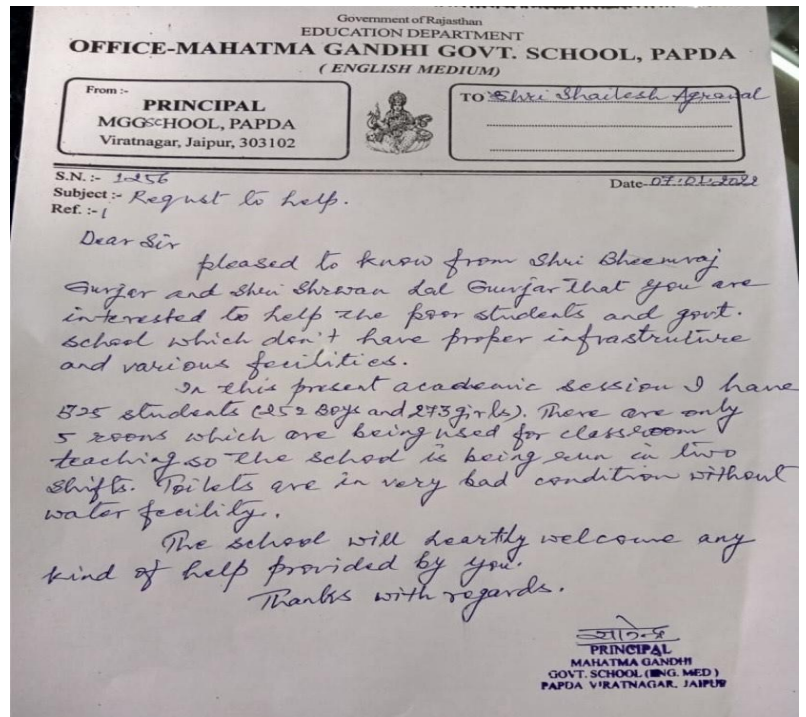
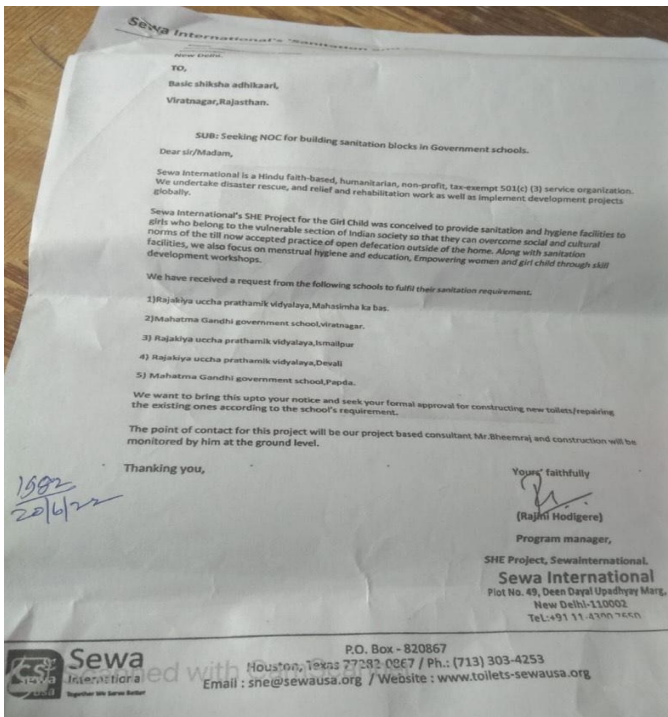


Figure : Schools and approval letters from viratnagar, rajasthan, India.

Our sewa team has identified few schools around Ghatampur region in kanpur,Uttarpradesh.

These schools are in very remote place and the nearby villages gets flooded everytime when they open the Dam gates,since it is on the banks of yamuna river.

Government around these areas serve the villagers as their shelter homes until the flood is receded.

Jayanth bhatt from SHE team visited these schools for a survey and construction/repairs of toilets will be starting soon.

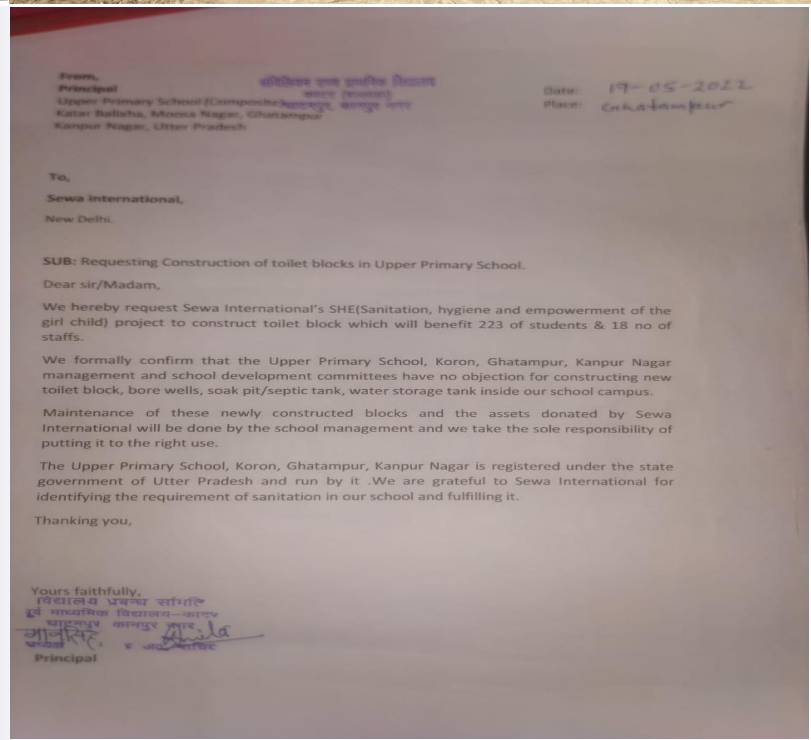
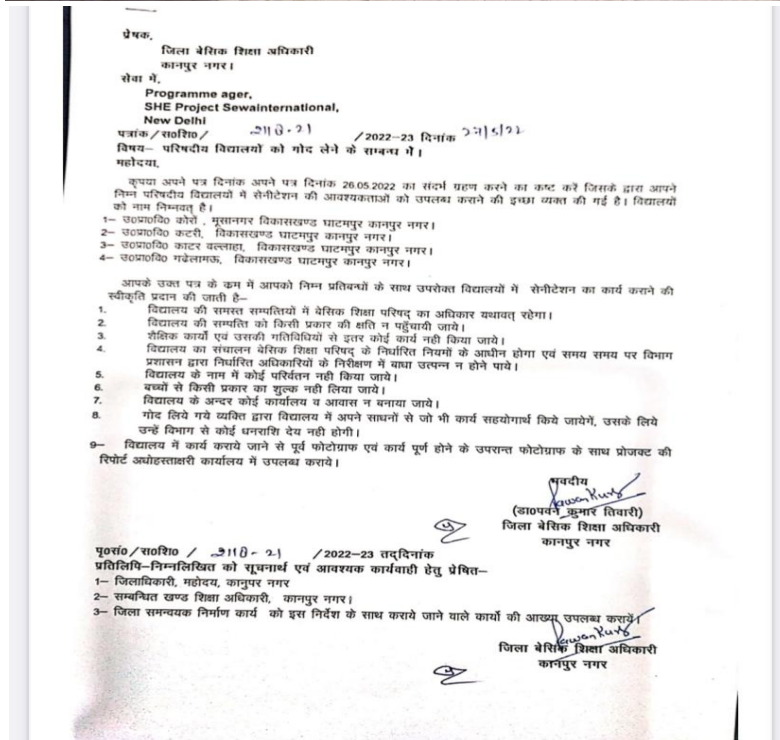


Figure:Approval letters and pictures of govt schools.



## Menstrual hygiene awareness camps

As a part of our SHE Program, Our team conducted menstrual hygiene awareness camps for 50 adolescent girls in Government upper primary school, Mayannur, Kerala. Local lady doctor attended this session and briefed these girls about maintaining their physical and mental health.

Free Re-usable cloth sanitary napkins were distributed for the all girl who attended the camp. This camp was conducted on 27/06/2022.

Another camp was done by our SHE team in Prathamik vidyalaya, Ramnagar, Chhavani, Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh for 50 adolescent girls.

Local lady doctor attended this session and briefed these girls about maintaining their physical and mental health. Free Re-usable cloth sanitary napkins were distributed for the all girl who attended the camp. This camp was conducted on 05/06/2022.
