






















EXPLODED DRAWING




STEP 1


Register your Jungle Gym Base. For info on warranty registration, see page 2.



To begin assembling, locate two middle upright 1's (1) and two middle upright 2's (2). Then set them in a square pattern making sure they sit exactly like the below image to continue with step 3.

Note: Pay close attention to which direction the short extensions face.







From the FRONT and REAR, slide a middle cross bar (8) through the top holes of each middle upright (1) and into the middle upright 2's (2). As you slide the cross bars through, add the plastic protectors (12) so the curves align with the middle uprights and the holes line up with the holes in the cross bars.

Now secure the bars, plastic protectors, and uprights with six M6x40mm bolts (15), six M6 washers (14) and six M6 locknuts (16).

DON'T tighten the locknuts yet.







From the LEFT and RIGHT, slide a middle cross bar (8) through the top holes of each middle upright (1) and into the middle upright 1's (2). As you slide the cross bars through, add the plastic protectors (12) so the curves align with the middle uprights and the holes line up with the holes in the cross bars.

Now secure the bars, plastic protectors, and uprights with six M6x40mm bolts (15), six M6 washers (14) and six M6 locknuts (16).

DON'T tighten the locknuts yet.







From the FRONT and REAR, slide a middle cross bar (8) through the middle holes of each middle upright (1) and into the opposite middle uprights (2). As you slide the cross bars through, add the plastic protectors (12) so the curves align with the middle uprights and the holes line up with the holes in the cross bars.

Now secure the bars, plastic protectors, and uprights with six M6x40mm bolts (15), six M6 washers (14) and six M6 locknuts (16).

DON'T tighten the locknuts yet.







TOP VIEW

From the LEFT and RIGHT, slide a middle cross bar (8) through the middle holes of each middle upright (1) and into the middle upright 2's (2). As you slide the cross bars through, add the plastic protectors (12) so the curves align with the middle uprights and the holes line up with the holes in the cross bars.

Now secure the bars, plastic protectors, and uprights with six M6x40mm bolts (15), six M6 washers (14) and six M6 locknuts (16).

DON'T tighten the locknuts yet.






Attach the short cross bar (9) to two top uprights (10) (make sure the extra extensions on the uprights are facing back.) Place two plastic protectors (12) against either side of the short cross bar (9) while attaching. At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the top uprights, plastic protectors, and short cross bars together with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14) and two M6 locknuts (16). On the side of the top uprights, secure with a M8X-65mm bolt (13) and arc washer (19).


Don't tighten the locknuts.





Attach the short cross bar (9) to two top uprights (10) (make sure the extra extensions on the uprights are facing forward.) Place two plastic protectors (12) against either side of the short cross bar (9) while attaching.

At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the top uprights, plastic protectors and short cross bar with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14) and two M6 locknuts (16). On the side of top upright, secure with a M8X65mm bolt (13) and arc washer (19).





Attach the two sections from step 7 and 8 together with short cross bars (9) as shown. Place two plastic protectors (12) against either side of the short cross bar (9) while attaching.

At the top of the plastic protectors, secure in place with four M6X40mm bolts (15), four M6 washers (14) and four M6 locknuts (16). On two sides, secure with two M8X65mm bolts (13) and arc washers (19).






Now starting on the **left side**, attach four short cross bars (9) to the open spots on the uprights. Make sure to place a plastic protector (12) against the uprights when attaching the short

Secure the uprights, plastic protectors and short cross bars with four M6X-40mm bolts (15), four M6 washers (14), and four M6 locknuts (16).

On the bottom inner spot of the rear middle upright 2 (1) secure that short cross bar with an additional M8X-65mm bolt (13) and arc washer (19) on the inside of the upright.









Locate a side upright 3 (3) and a side upright 1 (5). Place them side by side making sure the look like the image below. Then slide two long cross bars (7) through the top and middle holes of the side uprights. Place four plastic protectors (12) against either side of the uprights as you slide the long cross bars through.

Secure the uprights, plastic protectors, and long cross bars with eight M6X40mm bolts (15), eight M6 Washers (14) and eight M6 locknuts (16).










Still working on the **left side**, attach two short cross bars (9) to the two free sides at the bottom of side upright 3 (3) and side upright 1 (5), make sure to place two plastic protectors (12) at the connection points.

At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the side upright 3 (3), side upright 1 **(5)**, plastic protectors and short cross bars (9) with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14), and two M6 locknuts (16).


On the inner inside of side upright 3 (3) and side upright 1 (5) secure with two M8X65mm bolts (13) and two Arc









Locate a side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5). Place them side by side making sure they look like the image below. Then slide two long cross bars (7) through the top and middle holes of the side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5). Place four plastic protectors (12) against either side of the luprights as you slide the long cross bars through. Secure the uprights, plastic protectors and long cross bar in place with eight M6X40mm bolts (15), eight M6 washers (14) and eight M6 locknuts (16).











Still using the section from step 16, place two plastic protectors (12) and two short cross bars (9) onto the bottom extensions of the side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5). At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the uprights, plastic protectors and short cross bars with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14) and two M6 locknuts (16). At the bottom inside of the uprights secure the short cross bars with two M8X65mm button bolts (13) and two arc washers (19)


Now place three plastic protectors (12) and a corner upright (6) onto the bars sticking out from the side upright 1. Secure at the top of the plastic protectors with three M6X40mm bolts (15), three M6 washers (14) and three M6 locknuts (16). Then at the middle outside of the corner upright, place one M8x65mm button bolt and two arc washers.














Locate a side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5) and place them side by side making sure they look like the image below. Then slide two long cross bars (7) through the top and middle holes in the side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5). Place four plastic protectors (12) against either side of the uprights as you slide the cross bars through.

Secure the uprights, plastic protectors and long cross bar together with eight M6X40mm bolts (15), eight M6 Washers (14) and eight M6 locknuts (16).










Using the same section from step 20, place two plastic protectors and two short cross bars (9) onto the bottom extensions of the side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5). At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the uprights, plastic protectors and short cross bars with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14) and two M6 locknuts (16). At the bottom inside of the uprights secure the short cross bars with two M8x65mm button bolts (13) and two arc washers (19).

Now place three plastic protectors (12) and a corner upright (6) onto the bars sticking out from the *side upright* 2. At the top of the plastic protectors, secure together with three M6X40mm bolts (15), three M6 washers (14) and three M6 locknuts (16). Then at the outer top and bottom of the corner upright, place two M8x65mm button bolts (13) and two arc washers (19). Don't tighten the locknuts.







Place the section from step 21 onto the short cross bars (9) on the right side, first placing a plastic protector (12) at each connection point. At the top of the plastic protectors, secure the side upright 2 (4) and side upright 1 (5), corner upright (6), plastic protectors and short cross bars (9) in place with eight M6X40mm bolts (15), eight M6 washers (14) and eight M6 locknuts (16).

On the outer sides of the uprights secure at the top and middle connetions with five M8X65mm bolts (13) and five arc washers (19).

Don't tighten the locknuts.











Now working on the rear side, attach four short cross bars (9) to the open spots on the middle upright 1 (1) and middle upright 2 (2), make sure to place four plastic protectors (12) at each connection point.


At the top of the plastic protectors, secure in place with four M6X40mm bolts (15), four M6 washers (14) and four M6 locknuts (16).


On the bottom inner side of middle upright 1 (1) secure with a M8X65mm bolt (13) and arc washer (19).





Locate a side upright 3 (3) and side upright 1 (5) and place them side by side making sure they sit like the image below. Then slide two long cross bars (7) through the side upright 3 (3) and side upright 1 (5). Place four plastic protectors (12) against either side of the uprights as you slide the cross bars through. Secure the uprights, plastic protectors and long cross bar with eight M6X40mm bolts (15), eight M6 washers (14) and eight M6 locknuts (16).

Using the same section from step 24, place two plastic protectors (12) and two short cross bars (9) onto the bottom extensions of the side upright 3 (3) and side upright 1 (5). At the top of the plastic protectors, secure everything in place with two M6X40mm bolts (15), two M6 washers (14) and two M6 locknuts (16).


At the bottom inside of the uprights secure the short cross bars with two M8x65mm button bolts (13) and two arc washers (19).


Now place plastic protectors (12) and a corner upright (6) onto the bars sticking out from each side upright. At the top of the plastic protectors, secure everything in place with six M6X40mm bolts (15), six M6 washers (14) and six M6 locknuts (16).


Then at the outer top and bottom of the corner upright on the left, place two M8x65mm button bolts (13) and two arc washers (19). At the right corner upright, place one M8x65mm button bolt (13) and one arc washer (19) at the outer middle spot.

Don't tighten the locknuts.



INSTALLATION

WARNING!

To reduce the risk of serious injury, read all important precautions and instructions in this manual and all warnings on the Jungle Gym before assembly and use of this product.

- 1. It is the responsibility of the owner and supervisors of this Jungle Gym Base to make sure all users obey the safety instructions printed in this material.
- 2. This product is intended for use by children ages 4-10.
- Use the Jungle Gym only as described in this manual.
- 4. Always use the Jungle Gym under adult supervision.
- 5. Total weight capacity is 315 lbs.
- 6. Be sure that Jungle Gym is on a level surface, not less than 6 ft (1.8m) from any structure or obstruction such as a fence, garage, house, overhanging branches, laundry lines, or electrical wires.
- 7. Do not install over concrete, asphalt, packed earth, grass, carpet, or any other hard surface. The maximum fall height for the product is 6.2 ft (1.9 m). A fall onto a hard surface can result in serious injury or death.
- 8. It is recommended that the gym set be anchored to the ground. Be certain that all anchoring devices are placed below the level of the playing surface or below ground to prevent tripping. Anchors are sold separately.
- 9. It is recommended that the Jungle Gym be placed on shock absorbing surface. Shredded bark mulch, wood chips, fine sand or fine gravel are considered to be acceptable shock absorbing surfaces when installed and maintained at a sufficient depth under and around Jungle Gym Base Station.
- 10. Do not let children use equipment until properly assembled and anchored.
- 11. Always inspect the Jungle Gym before it is used and replace any worn, defective, or missing parts and tighten any bolts that have become loose. (Users may be hurt if the Jungle Gym is used when it is in poor condition.)

MAINTENANCE & CARE INFORMATION

Congratulations on successfully assembling your new ActivPlay Jungle Gym Base! Now, the best way to keep your new jungle gym in tip-top shape, is to follow this checklist periodically:

At the beginning of each play season:

- Tighten all hardware
- Lubricate all metallic moving parts
- Check all protective coverings on bolts, pipes, edges, and corners. Replace if they are loose, cracked, or missing
- Check all moving parts including swing seats, ropes, cables, and chains for wear, rust, or other deterioration.

 Replace as needed
- Check metal parts for rust. If found, sand and repaint using a nonlead-based paint meeting the requirements of 16 CFR 1303
- Reinstall any plastic parts, such as swing seats or any other items that were removed for the cold season

Twice a month during play season:

- Tighten all hardware
- Check all protective coverings on bolts, pipes, edges, and corners. Replace if they are loose, cracked, or missing
- Rake and check depth of loose fill protective surfacing materials to prevent compaction and to maintain appropriate depth. Replace as necessary
- Spot clean frame when dirt accumulates
- Children should be instructed to never attach items to the playground equipment that are not specifically designed for use with the equipment, such as, but not limited to, jump ropes, clothesline, pet leashes, cables and chain as they may cause a strangulation hazard

Once a month during play season:

- Lubricate all metallic moving parts
- Check all moving parts including swing seats, ropes, cables, and chains for wear, rust, or other deterioration. Replace as needed

At the end of each play season or when the temperature drops below 32°F:

- Remove plastic swing seats and other items as specified by the manufacturer and take indoors or do not use
- Rake and check depth of loose fill protective surfacing materials to prevent compaction and to maintain appropriate depth. Replace as necessary
- Owners shall be responsible for maintaining the legibility of the warning labels

Disposal Instructions: If discarding, Disassemble and dispose of the playground equipment in such a way that no unreasonable hazards will exist at the time the playground equipment is discarded.

If any these conditions exist, this product should be disassembled or otherwise protected from being used until the condition is fixed.

JUNGLE GYM SAFETY INFORMATION

A Jungle Gym is a recreational product.

The information on this manual identify important safety precautions. The precautions are not all-inclusive, because a Jungle Gym can be used in ways that this manual cannot cover completely.

USING THE JUNGLE GYM SAFELY Adult Supervision of Children

Children using the Jungle Gym must be supervised by adults at all times. Adults may pay particular attention to:

- Entering and exiting the Jungle Gym safely
- Appropriate clothing, No loose-fitting clothing, scarf's, ponchos or clothing that is potentially hazardous.
- Do not attach items to the Jungle Gym that are not specifically designed for use with the equipment, such as but not limited to, jump ropes, clothesline, pet leashes, cables, extension cords, garden hose and chains as they may cause a strangulation hazard
- Darkness increases the chances of a fall. Do not use the Jungle Gym unless there is plenty of lighting provided

Electrocutions Hazard Associated with the Metal Frame of the Jungle Gym

The Jungle Gym frame is made of metal. It is not grounded and will conduct electricity. For this reason, an electrocution hazard exists. No light, electric heaters, extension cords or household electrical appliances are to be permitted in or on the Jungle Gym at any time.

Placing the Jungle Gym in a Safe Place

To avoid injury, the Jungle Gym must be kept away from objects and possible hazards including electric power wiring, tree limbs, and fences. Do not place the Jungle Gym near any other recreational device or structures such as a swimming pool or hot tub. The Jungle Gym must be placed on a level surface before use. The area around the Jungle Gym must always have plenty of light.

For the Supervisor

Be familiar with the information in this manual and enforce all of the safety rules. Help new users and all user to the Jungle Gym. All Jungle Gym users must have someone watch them, regardless of the skill or age of the user. Keep the Jungle Gym free of any objects that could interfere with the proper use of the Jungle Gym such as but not limited to, jump ropes, clothesline, pet leashes, cables, extension cords, garden hose and chains as they may cause a strangulation hazard.

For the Jungle Gym User

Do not use the Jungle Gym when under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Do not attempt to jump onto or off of the Jungle Gym. Wear clothing that does not have drawstrings, hooks, loops or anything else that can get caught in the Jungle Gym.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE


To reduce the risk of serious injury, read and follow all of the warnings, precautions, and instructions in this manual before you use this equipment. Warnings and instructions for care, maintenance, and use of this Jungle Gym are included to promote safe enjoyable use of this equipment.

- 1. The Jungle Gym is designed for up to 3 people and has a 315lb. total weight limit.
- 2. On-site adult supervision for children of all ages at all times is required.
- 3. Instruct children not to walk close to, in front of, behind, or between moving items. Instruct children to keep a safe distance away to keep from being struck by items in play.
- Instruct children not to twist swing chains or ropes or loop them over the top support bar since this may reduce the strength of the chain rope.
- Instruct children to avoid swinging empty seats.
 These may strike other children or come back and strike you.
- 6. Teach children to sit in the center of the swings with their full weight on the seats. DO NOT allow children to stand on the seats and DO NOT allow children to lean to the side or collide with other playmates.
- 7. Instruct children not to use the equipment in any manner other than intended.
- 8. Instruct children not to get off equipment while it is in motion. Do not allow children to jump from moving play items.
- Dress children in appropriate clothing while playing on and around the equipment. Do not allow the children to wear loose fitting clothing, hood and neck drawstrings, scarves, cord-connected items, capes, and ponchos. These items can cause death by strangulation.
- 10. Do not allow children to play on equipment when it is wet. Injury due to slips or falls may occur.

- 11. Instruct children not to attach items to the playground equipment that are not specifically designed for use with the equipment, such as, but not limited to, jump ropes, clothesline, pet leashes, cables and chain as they may cause a strangulation hazard.
- 12. Instruct children to always grasp the Jungle Gym frame rails while playing and climbing.
- 13. Check the openings between rollers and sliding surfaces of rollers slides for materials that could be potentially hazardous.
- 14. Make sure that suspended climbing ropes, chain, or cable are secured at both ends and cannot be looped back on itself.
- 15. Instruct children to remove their bike or other sports helmets before playing.
- Dress children with well-fitting and full foot enclosing footwear. Do not wear clogs, flip flops, and sandals.
- 17. WARNING: Lawn swings are designed for use by children two years of age and older. The use by children under the age of two can result in entrapment between the seat and back rest because the child's body may pass through the opening, causing entrapment of the child's head. Such entrapment may result in strangulation. NEVER place children in a rearward facing position or with legs between the seat and backrest.
- 18. Instruct children to step on and off of the Jungle Gym, do not jump.
- 19. Check bolts before every use. Tighten any bolts that have become loose before allowing children to play.

PLAYGROUND SURFACING MATERIALS

The following information is from Section 4 of the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission's (USCPSC) Outdoor Home Playground Safety Handbook for playground surfacing material.

- X3. SECTION 4 OF THE CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION'S OUTDOOR HOME PLAYGROUND SAFETY HANDBOOK
- **X3.1** Select Protective Surfacing One of the most important things you can do to reduce the likelihood of serious head injuries is to install shock-absorbing protective surfacing under and around your play equipment. The protective surfacing should be applied to a depth that is suitable for the equipment height in accordance with ASTM Specification F1292. There are different types of surfacing to choose from; which ever product you select, follow these guidelines:
- X3.1.1 Loose Fill Materials:
 - **X3.1.1.1** Maintain a minimum depth of 9 inches of loose-fill materials such as wood mulch/chips, engineered wood fiber (EWF), or shredded/recycled rubber mulch for equipment up to 8 feet high; and 9 inches of sand or pea gravel for equipment up to 5 feet high. NOTE: An initial fill level of 12 inches will compress to about a 9-inch depth of surfacing over time. The surfacing will also compact, displace, and settle, and should be periodically refilled to maintain at least a 9-inch depth.
- **X3.1.2** Use a minimum of 6 inches of protective surfacing for play equipment less than 4 feet in height. If maintained properly, this should be adequate. (At depths less than 6 inches, the protective material is too easily displaced or compacted.) NOTE: Do not install home playground equipment over concrete, asphalt, or any other hard surface. A fall onto a hard surface can result in serious injury to the equipment user. Grass and dirt are not considered protective surfacing because wear and environmental factors can reduce their shock absorbing effectiveness. Carpeting and thin mats are generally not adequate protective surfacing. Ground level equipment such as a sandbox, activity wall, playhouse or other equipment that has no elevated play surface does not need any protective surfacing.
- **X3.1.3** Use containment, such as digging out around the perimeter and/or lining the perimeter with landscape edging. Don't forget to account for water drainage.
 - **X3.1.3.1** Check and maintain the depth of the loose-fill surfacing material. To maintain the right amount of loose-fill materials, mark the correct level on play equipment support posts. That way you can easily see when to replenish and/ or redistribute the surfacing.
 - X3.1.3.2 Do not install loose fill surfacing over hard surfaces such as concrete or asphalt.
- **X3.1.4** Poured-In-Place Surfaces or Pre-Manufactured Rubber Tiles You may be interested in using surfacing other than loose-fill materials like rubber tiles or poured-in-place surfaces.
 - **X3.1.4.1** Installations of these surfaces generally require a professional and are not "do-it-yourself" projects.
 - **X3.1.4.2** Review surface specifications before purchasing this type of surfacing. Ask the installer/manufacturer for a report showing that the product has been tested to the following safety standard: ASTMF 1292 Standard Specification for Impact Attenuation of Surfacing Materials within the Use Zone of Playground Equipment. This report should show the specific height for which the surface is intended to protect against serious head injury. This height should be equal to or greater than the fall height vertical distance between a designated play surface (elevated surface for standing, sitting, or climbing) and the protective surfacing below of your play equipment.
 - X3.1.4.3 Check the protective surfacing frequently for wear.
- **X3.1.5** Placement Proper placement and maintenance of protective surfacing is essential. Be sure to:
 - X3.1.5.1 Extend surfacing at least 6 feet from the equipment in all directions.
 - **X3.1.5.2** For to-fro swings, extend protective surfacing in front of and behind the swing to a distance equal to twice the height of the top bar from which the swing is suspended.
 - **X3.1.5.3** For tire swings, extend surfacing in a circle whose radius is equal to the height of the suspending chain or rope, plus 6 feet in all directions.

LIMITED WARRANTY
