4. FIRST AID MEASURES

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Water spray, alcohol resistant foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

Special fire fighting procedures: Fire fighter should wear positive pressure self-contained breathing apparatus. Water

should be used to cool closed containers to prevent pressure build-up and possible

auto ignition or explosion when exposed to extreme heat.

Unusual fire or explosion hazards: Vapors may accumulate in low confined areas, travel considerable distance to sources

of ignition, and flash back

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Use personal protection equipment recommended in section 8, isolate the hazard area and deny entry to unnecessary and unprotected personnel.

Environmental precautions: Remove all sources of ignition. Prevent product from entering drains or waterways.

Clean-up methods: Ensure adquate ventilation. Contain spillage , if safe to do so. Soak up with inert absorbent material (e.g.

sand, earth, diatomaceous earth, vermiculite). Store in partially filled closed container until proper disposal.
