Your first Tabayer ring

Measuring your finger is the most accurate way to find your size, and we recommend this over measuring another ring.

1. Using a length of ribbon or string, form a comfortable yet secure loop around the base of the finger on which you'll wear your Tabayer ring.
2. Keeping the ends pinched, move the loop along the length of your finger to check that it slides over your knuckle easily.
3. Once you have the right size, use a pen to mark the points where the ends of the loop meet.
4. Lay the ribbon or string flat against a ruler and measure the distance between the two points to the closest millimeter.
5. Match the measurement to the ring size on the chart below to find your size.

- Measure at the end of the day, when fingers tend to be largest; finger size can change throughout the day or with different weather.
- Your fingers are smallest when wet or cold, and largest when very warm, so avoid measuring them when this is the case.
- If you find your measurement lies between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger one.

If you already wear a Tabayer ring
Our sizing is consistent throughout the collections. If you already wear a Tabayer ring, you can find your size inside the band.

Choosing a Tabayer ring as a gift
The simplest way to measure a ring if you'd like to offer one as a gift is to borrow one of their rings with a similar band, or use one you know fits their finger well. Place the ring on top of the size circles provided on the last page. The outline must lie fully inside the ring. If the measurement lies between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size.

The printable sizing guide below can be used to match the measurement to the size chart. To ensure the printable sizing guide is accurate, check your printer's settings before you begin.

1. In the printing settings or print dialogue box, the page scaling should be set to "none", "100\%" or "actual size"
2. Print this page on full letter size A4 paper.
3. Once printed, use a ruler to check the measurements are accurate. The sample guide provided should measure exactly 0.78 inches (2 centimeters).

Size Guide
Bracelets

There are three ways to find the correct size for your Tabayer bracelet: measuring a bracelet you own; measuring your wrist with a ribbon or tape measure; or using the printable bracelet sizer provided on the last page.

Measuring a bracelet you own

Measuring a flexible bracelet that fits well is a good way to determine the best size for your Tabayer bracelet. If you're buying a bracelet as a gift, this is the simplest way to choose a size that fits.

1. Lay the bracelet on a flat surface and measure its length, from the top of the clasp to the other end.
2. Match the measurement to the size chart below to find your size. If you find your measurement lies between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger one.

Measuring your wrist

1. Using a length of ribbon or string, form a loop around the wrist on which you'll wear your Tabayer bracelet.
2. Once you have the right size, use a pen to mark the points where the ends of the loop meet.
3. 3. Lay the ribbon or string flat against a ruler and measure the distance between the two points to the closest millimeter, adding 0.4 inches ( 10 millimeters) for a comfortable fit, or 0.8 inches (20 millimeters) for a looser fit.
1. Match the measurement to the size chart below to find your size. If you find your measurement lies between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger one.

If you have a tape measure, you can skip the first two steps and use the measurement where the number meets the 0 around your wrist.

The bracelet sizer can be printed and used to find an accurate measurement by looping it around your wrist exactly as you'd like to wear your bracelet. To ensure the printable bracelet sizer is accurate, check your printer's settings before you begin.

1. In the printing settings or print dialogue box, the page scaling should be set to none or actual size.
2. Print this page on full letter size A4 paper.
3. Once printed, use a ruler to check the measurements are accurate. The sample should measure exactly 0.8 inches ( 2 centimeters).
4. Cut out the bracelet sizer as marked, making a slit at the part marked "cut here" that the pointed tip will feed through.
5. With the numbers visible on the outside, insert the tip through the slit at the opposite end to form a large loop which you can fit your hand through.
6. Pull the tip until it forms a tight yet comfortable loop on your wrist.
7. The number that lines up with the slit is your wrist size, which you can use to follow the steps under "measuring your wrist". Alternatively, you can loosen the sizer slightly until you have found the measurement of how you'd like your Tabayer bracelet to fit an avoid adding to the wrist measurement to get your desired fit.
8. Match the measurement to the size chart below to find your size. If you find your measurement lies between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger one.

If you already wear a Tabayer bracelet
Our sizing is consistent throughout the collections. If you already wear a Tabayer bracelet, you can find your size on the inside. If you would like your new bracelet to have a looser or tighter fit, simply choose the size up or down, or follow the steps above to measure your wrist or a bracelet you already own.

To visualize how the pendants and different chain lengths will sit on you, the simplest way is to follow this measuring guide.

## Measuring the pendant chain length

1. Take a note of the chain length indicated in the product information of the Tabayer pendant you like
2. On a length of ribbon or string, measure out the length from one end and mark it with a pen
3. Place the end of the ribbon against your neck or chest, looping the other end around your neck to meet it. This will allow you to see how this length will sit on you.

## Necklaces

The fit of necklaces varies by design. While the length provides an indication, the weight of each necklace is distributed depending on its design and shape, which affects how it sits on your neck. With our photography we aim to make it easy to visualize how the necklace will look on you.
