Make Upcycled Rain Boot Planters

Kids grow out of shoes so fast! Don't toss those adorable rain boots just because they're a little too tight – turn them into whimsical planters! It's a lovely way to turn something that would otherwise end up in a landfill into something beautiful and functional.

Step 1

Use a drill or knife to create a drainage hole in the bottom of the boot. This step is for grown-ups only!

Step 2

Line the bottom of the boot with a thin layer of pebbles. This will help weigh down the boot, and allow for water to drain.

Step 3

Fill the boot about halfway full with dirt.

Step 4

Place the flower in the boot, then carefully fill more dirt in around the roots.

Step 5

Water well, give it some sunshine, and watch it grow!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Rain boots
- A drill or knife (adults only!)
- Pebbles and Dirt
- Flowers



Make Upcycled T-Shirt Bowls

Stains, rips, tears – kids can be pretty hard on their clothes, and throwing away a shirt because of one little stain can feel like a waste. Cut down on clutter, while repurposing old clothes!

Step 1

Flip the bowl upside down, and cover with plastic wrap.

Step 2

Cut a piece from the shirt large enough to cover the bowl.

Step 3

Dip the fabric in Mod Podge, and squeeze out the excess.

Step 4

Place the fabric over the bowl, and smooth it around the shape of the bowl. Let dry.

Step 5

Once completely dry, tug the plastic wrap to loosen the fabric from the mixing bowl. Even out the edges of your fabric bowl by trimming with scissors.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Scissors
- Mod Podge
- Bowl
- Plastic wrap
- T shirt



Make No-Sew Sock Buddies!

These funny little friends are adorable gifts, and are so easy to make, the whole family can help. All you need to get started is a pair of scissors, and your sock friends are on their way to exciting adventures that don't involve just taking up space in the bottom of the sock drawer.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- 2 socks
- Rubber bands
- A glue gun (adults only!), or fabric glue
- Alcohol-based markers
- Fabric scraps, and embellishments like buttons, beads, ribbons, and googly eyes
- Rice, or fiberfill stuffing

Step 1

Choose a sock for the body. Fill with fiberfill stuffing, or rice. Tie off with a rubber band.

Step 2

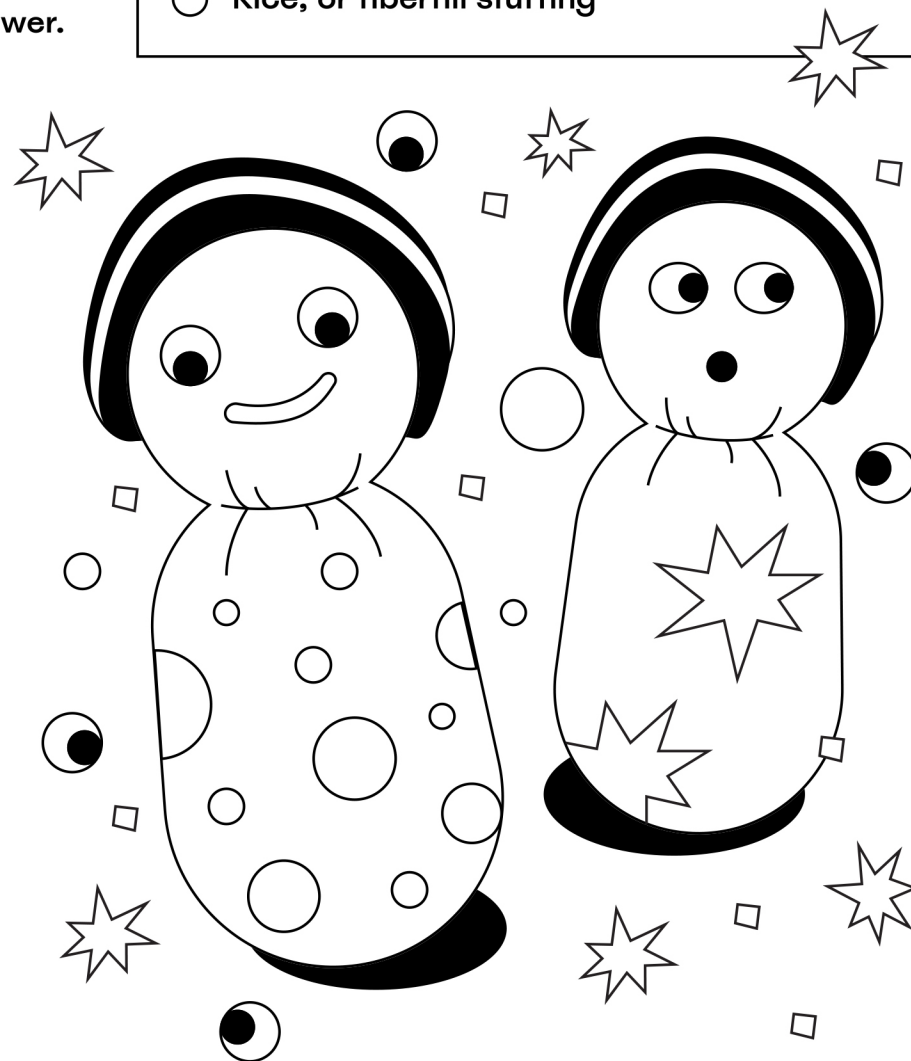
Take another rubber band and twist it around the upper middle part to create a head.

Step 3

Cut the toe part out of another sock, and roll the edges till it fits the head like a hat.

Step 4

Decorate with markers and embellishments!
