Pumpkin Wee Be Little A 1999 All-American Selection winner that is ideal for cooking, painting and carving. These fruits are baseball sized and weigh 1/2 pound. The vines have a semi-bush habit which doesn't require a lot of room in the garden. The fruits have smooth bright orange rinds with dark stems.



Pumpkin Harvest Jack F1 Great in the garden, Harvest Jack has a medium-length fruit and a vigorous plant structure. These dark-orange pumpkins with a 4-inch handle weigh 22 to 28 pounds. They mature fully in 105 days and have exceptional yield potential under most growing conditions.



Pumpkin Pepitas F1

The newest All-America Selections award winning pumpkin, Pepitas, is a winner in both the decorative and culinary arenas. Pepitas is named for its hulless or naked seeds (pepitas) that lack the tough outer hull, making them easier to eat either fresh or roasted. Each high-yield plant produces numerous uniform, medium-sized (9 to 12 pound) beautifully striped pumpkins on healthy, diseaseresistant vines.



Pumpkin American Tondo

Also known as Mexican ribbed pumpkin, American Tondo is an 8- to 10-pound decorative heirloom squash with yellow flesh and distinctive large ribs. Plants are vining and set a very large crop of uniform green-and-yellow-striped fruit. If you have never grown this ornamental squash in your garden, you must.



Pumpkin Cinderella's Carriage

A dream come true for any princess-loving child, this bright reddish-orange pumpkin is the first hybrid Cinderella-type pumpkin on the market. It has a higher yield as well as powdery mildew resistance. Robust and vigorous vines produce large fruits ranging from 25 to 35 pounds, creating a whole grouping of carriages for all the princesses in your family.



Pumpkin First Prize F1 The size of this pumpkin ranges from 50 pounds to a whopping 150 pounds! With color superior to the Atlantic types, this will be a great addition for those who want the biggest and best. The fruit matures on vigorous vines 120 days from planting. Compare to Prizewinner F1.



Pumpkin Tours

A French heirloom pumpkin named for its origin. Large-fruited with distinctive large oil seeds with wide margins that were once used in the manufacture of sugar-coated pills and as a remedy for tapeworm. The fruit is dark green with large, light-green stripes running from the top to the bottom. These large pumpkins weigh 16 to 18 pounds and are excellent for carving and fall decoration. The seeds are as big as a thumb and are great for roasting.



Pumpkin Mini Harvest Blend F1

These ornamental hybrids also have excellent edible qualities. Bumpkin has a semi-bush plant habit with excellent yield potential. Fruits are larger and smoother than Jack Be Little with dark-orange skin and strong, dark-green handles. Gooligan is a Baby Boo hybrid; vines are vigorous and set high numbers of unique, white pumpkins. Hooligan is a bicolored Jack Be Little hybrid with orange-and-white mottled fruit. Grow all three for a great novelty mixture.
