INSTRUCTION MANUAL

Read this "INSTRUCTION MANUAL" carefully before use.

[Handling Instructions]

- Do not use for purposes other than the intended use of the product.
- Be careful not to cut your hands or fingers when using
- During sharpening, excessive force may damage the sharpener or grindstone.
- Wipe off the water after use.
- Cannot be used for the blades before July 2023.
- Sharpen up to 4 times per a sharpening blade.
 - *Depending on the state of the cutting edge
 - *Sharpening reduces the overlap width of the blade, increases the distance from the presser foot.
 - *Depending on the leather, skiving state may change.
- When there is a large chip on the blade, cannot be sharpened.
- If you store the sharpening blade fixing screw in a tightened state, may stick.
- Cannot be used for high grade blades.
- Recommended Grindstone: KING S-1, granularity: #6000, size: 210×73×22mm


[How to use]

① Attach the blade using the hex wrench that came with the sharpener.

Remove the two screws with hex wrench.

After setting the blade, tighten the screw again to fix it.

- *Over-tightening may damage the screw holes.
- 2 Prepare the grindstone.
 - *Check the instruction manual for the grindstone you are using.
- 3 Adjust the guide to fit the width of the grindstone Adjust the left and right width with a Phillips screwdriver. (Guide expansion width: 66mm ~ 75mm)



④ Slide back and forth about 10 to 15 times along the guide.

Set the sharpener on the grindstone and start sharpening.

*The strength is just enough to lightly press the sharpener.



(5) Adjust the rollers (If the blade is not sharpened)
Loosen the screws with a Phillips screwdriver,
adjust roller position.

Front of roller : obtuse angle Back of roller : acute angle

Obtuse angle:

Durability UP and sharpness DOWN compared to acute angle.

Acute angle:

Durability DOWN and sharpness UP compared to obtuse angle.

*The initial setting position is set to a position that balances sharpening durability.

Turn the blade over and back and forth the same number of times.

Remove the blade in step ① and turn it over.

Repeat step ④ the same number of times as the first time.

Remove the blade from the sharpener, use after wiping off water.
Blade may rust if wet.
