



How to Play

- 1 Hold the kokiriko with both hands at either end.



- 2 Use a slight twisting motion with each hand to angle the slats against each other and produce the 'click-clack' sound.



- 3 Try using one hand to play the kokiriko by flicking your wrist up and down.



Did you Know?



The kokiriko is a traditional Japanese instrument used in folk songs and rural dances.



Traditionally made with bamboo slats held together with a leather strap.



Also known as a Binzasara or pocket rattle, the slats produce a sound similar to falling dominoes.
