for the next 10-14 days



No Licking!

Licking or chewing at the incision can cause infection. E-collars are always recommended.



Check the Incision

What you see today is normal. Check twice a day for redness, swelling or discharge.

(The small, green tattoo indicates spayed or neutered.)

Keep it Dry

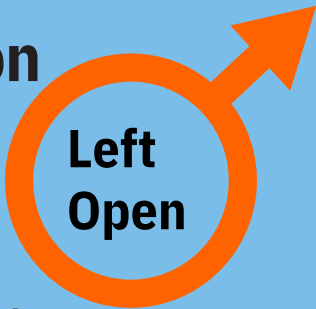
Water affects surgical glue & opens the incision, causing infection. No bathing or swimming for 2 weeks.



Incisions on Males are

Left Open

It is normal to see swelling & red discharge for a few days during the healing process.



Separate Animals

Keep females away from un-neutered males.



Feed a Simple Diet

Do not give your pet junk food, special treats, table scraps or milk.



No Human Medication!

It is dangerous & can be fatal! Your pet has already received long-acting pain medication.



Inside rest gives the tissue time to heal & helps the incision stay closed.

(No running, jumping, or playing for 14 days.)



We will make every reasonable effort to treat at our clinic, at minimal cost, any postoperative complications resulting directly from the surgery, if these instructions are followed in full.

Contact us immediately if you notice:

Pale gums; problems walking; loss of appetite 48 hours after surgery; vomiting 24 hours after surgery; heavy discharge or bleeding from the incision; difficulty breathing; lethargy.
