NEITHER THE RETAILER NOR THE MANUFACTURER WILL ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR DAMAGE (COLOR FADING) TO ARTICLES AS A RESULT OF USING DIDI SEVEN.

DIRECTIONS FOR SAFE USE AND STORAGE

CAUTION: DIDI SEVEN IS A CHEMICAL PRODUCT AND THEREFORE SHOULD BE STORED SAFELY OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.

- 1. Store with the cap tightly closed to prevent drying out.
- 2. Store at room temperature, away from open flame or spark.

FIRST AID TREATMENT

- If Didi Seven gets into eyes, flush thoroughly with water from the corner of the eye towards the nose - CONSULT YOUR DOCTOR
- If accidentally ingested, NO NOT INDUCE VOMITING and CONSULT YOUR DOCTOR.







HOW TO USE:

- 1. FIRST PERFORM A COLORFAST TEST. Simply perform this test in an inconspicuous area of the item. After application, if there is no difference in the color, the material is colorfast and you can proceed with stain removal. Even a slight discoloration means the article is NOT colorfast. In this case, do not use Didi Seven super concentrate cleaner on the fabric! Also, materials used for linens are usually not colorfast. Even water can cause dyes to run. Therefore, separate any lining or other fabrics from the area being treated.
- Blot up any excess liquid with a dry, clean rag or paper towel. If the stain is solid, GENTLY brush or scrape off the excess.
- 3. If possible, rinse the stained area under a tap.
 (If stain is on carpet or upholstery, simply flush with water.)
- Gently apply a thin film of Didi Seven to the stained area with a soft cloth. (For carpet and upholstery apply using a soft brush or sponge.)
- 5. Apply enough water so that Didi Seven is practically dissolved.
- 6. Gently dab (do not apply pressure to the treated area with a WET cloth until the stain is removed. DO NOT leave Didi Seven on colored materials for longer than 5 minutes. The use of a brush may damage fabric fibers and is not recommended for delicate materials.
- 7 THOROUGHLY rinse all traces of Didi Seven from articles.
- Leave to DRIP/AIR DRY. DO NOT use a clothes dryer for fabrics. If you have not removed all of the stain, the dryer may "set" the stain. (For carpet and upholstery, blot the area thoroughly with a paper towel. Let dry.)
- When the stain is completely removed, wash and dry the article as instructed by the garment care tag.
- 10. If stain remains, repeat Steps 1 through 9. If after repeating Steps 1 through 9 the stain still remains, attempt the steam method referred to on our website.

Things to Remember:

- Always follow instructions on the Garment Care Tag.
- Didi Seven is always activated with either water or steam. Rust is the exception activate with lemon.
- When activating Didi Seven with water, select water temperature based on the stain chart found at the end of these instructions.
- The steam method of stain removal should only be employed if the regular, water-activated method doesn't work after repeated attempts.
- After treating a fabric with Didi Seven rinse thoroughly with water and let drip dry. DO NOT PLACE IN DRYER. If stain remains after treatment with Didi Seven, repeat the stain removal process.
- Didi Seven will not remove substances that are intended to leave permanent ink, paint, or dyes.
- Some types of carpet (like nylon or wool) could be adversely affected by steam.
 Be sure to test in an inconspicuous area of carpet before treating the stain.



To use Didi Seven as a solution, simply squeeze a dime-sized amount of Didi Seven into an 8 oz. measuring cup. Add hot water and stir thoroughly until dissolved completely. Pour into an empty spray bottle or other suitable container to tackle your toughest household cleaning needs.



For ultra-bright whites, add approx. 4 oz. of this solution along with your regular laundry detergent to your washing machine (with a full load.) Extremely stained or discolored whites should soak in a solution for at least two hours. Rinse thoroughly, drip or air dry.

<u>IO REMOVE RUSI:</u> Ireat the stain with lemon juice or vinegar rather than water Then follow instructions for regular stain removal.

<u>TO REMOVE TAR:</u> Apply an oil (butter, mineral oil, etc.) to break down the tars consistency to a liquid. Use mild soap and water to remove liquified tar. Treat residue stain by following Didi Seven stain remover instructions.
