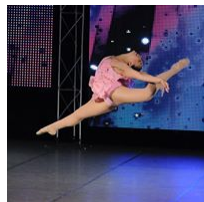

Racing is back as surely as we knew it would. This fall's 508 races fell one short of the record set in the spring of 2017. With today's many worries, runners enjoy the safer camaraderie of outdoor events. The great outdoors is just that... great. Even a run in the rain beats staying indoors. Running in a race is more motivating than heading out on the road alone. Pre-race and post-race are just as important to the experience as the race itself, as many lifelong friends are made at these events.

Running is age based more than any other sport. Only the truly gifted and motivated racers can hope to maintain against younger runners, even for a short while. If you can run as fast as you did last year, you are really better. Five-year age groups were established to even the playing field, and de facto create multiple mini events. Runners want to know how they performed within their age group. Knowing a runner's age is vital in scoring results.

Hometown is important for the runner rankings as we do not include out of the region runners. Many of the big events have hundreds or even thousands of out of region runners, the region being Maryland, Virginia, and Washington, DC. Unfortunately, not listing the hometown makes those results ineligible for the rankings.

These days we expect nearly instant results. This can be done and the good timing companies usually post results from the race site. Indeed, many runners eagerly pick up their phone to check results while the race is still going on. This adds to the excitement of the race. Runners also really enjoy the events that have photographers on site that provide enhanced race day memories.

The numbers of runners were leveling off after increasing every year since the turn of the century. Yet, the numbers of races continue to climb. The region has many thousands of races. The successful ones, the sustainable ones, offer value to the runner. The basics of a good race is good management. The numbers have risen back to 100 percent of the pre-pandemic numbers.

The race must have quality control over the distance and the course marshaling of the event. To have the award winners determined, the event must have credible timing equipment. Runners want results quickly and accurately. This is readily possible for even the largest races. Runners know what they themselves ran. Virtually every runner has a GPS timing device and knows their time and how close the race was to the promised distance. They also want to know how they did in comparison to the rest of the field.

The results should include at a minimum the runner's name, age, hometown, and gun time, and be sorted by the gun time. Races will at times have additional information such as net time, place in division, or a video of the finish.

Major races rose to 35, the larger events often not drawing as much as they could. Runners have more choices. Total race times increased twenty-five percent over 2022 to 153,345 and is now 95 percent of 2019, though still behind other past years. Total races increased thirty percent, and ranked runners a generous fifteen percent compared to 2022.

The four Baltimore Running Festival events garnered just short of ten thousand racers. The three Richmond events included 45 percent more at 14,505. Richmond crushed competition-wise, 832 to 172 in ranked runners.

This season, five races featured 100 ranked qualifiers, and again a meager eleven races featured fifty or more ranked runners for the third year in a row. The Richmond Half Marathon pushed the Army Ten Miler aside as the top dog with 395 to 357. Both were massive improvements from 2022. The Richmond Marathon drew 271 ranked runners, ahead of the Bay Bridge 10K that subsided to 166 ranked runners. The shortest distance in Richmond, the 8K, drew 166 ranked Runners. The Marine Corps took sixth with 96 ranked runners.

Ten-kilometer races were run 67 times, but only four of them contained more than 500 finishers. Bay Bridge accounted for more than half of all the 10K runners as well as forty-four percent of the ranked times. Marine Corps finally became competitive (65), followed by Anthem Wicked (45) and Baltimore United Way (44).

The 5 Mile/8K settled at just 14 events, including the huge Allianz Partners 8K with the fifth most ranked runners (166). The second largest, Octoberfest 5M, dropped off the map in ranked runners. The Downs Park 5M outdid them by four (at 25) with just 20 percent as many runners. The Neptune Festival 8K showcased even more runners (second highest at 747) by even fewer ranked runners.

Nineteen races featured more than a thousand finishers to nearly match 2019's 21 and tie 2021's 19. Four of these were 5Ks with the Race for Every Child 5K. The Baltimore United Way was second in size with the most ranked runners (42), but that is barely half of last year's total. The most competitive 5K was the Weighted Angels 5K with 41 and about a ninth as many racers.

Of the race finishers who ran at least one qualifying time, both sexes reached record level. Women increased their lead over the men with 2,528 to 1,957 finishers. In total, there were 697 ranked runners for both the men and the women. The men at 329 fell short of just 2019's all-time record of record 338. The women presented 368 for the fourth highest total. Additionally, 95 runners

qualified for the Elite Division this season. Of these runners, thirty-seven of them came from other divisions. The largest age groups are the seniors, women 60-64 with sixty-one (the largest division). For the men, 60-64 with fifty-one was easiliest the largest division. There are 1,548 different women and 1,045 different men who ran at least one qualifier.

To help explain the table below, take for example the 65-69 men's division. Twenty-three runners (Total of Ranked Men) among themselves combined to race 76 times (Men Ranked Races of qualifiers). One Hundred and fifty-one runners (Total Men's qualifying racers) means that by subtracting the total qualifying races (151) from the total races by qualifiers (76) you have (75) men who ran just one race at a ranked time and thus did not qualify. The (23) men who did qualify with two or more races ran a total of 76 qualifying races.

In the first table, we show the average totals over the years. During that period there have been more than 22,000 races with more than 3,300 major races. There have been more than 9.5 million racing times, accumulating more than 266,000 ranked times.

We are posting in **blue** all the runners with **National Class** times (80%) of the top-rated time for each division based on their best time in 10K equivalence. The times are based on the youngest in each division except for the 19 and younger, where it becomes the eldest time, which is for the strongest time. There will be some runners who are up to the 80% level by being on the older side of the 5-year division that are missed. However, in this manner, everyone in **blue** will be at least 80%.

For this period, more than half the women's divisions had one **National Class** racer ranked, a total of 38. In the Open division, there were twenty-two though seven double dipped from other groups. The men were even more impressive with 70 **National Class** racers, though there were four age groups that had none, the four eldest divisions. In the Open division, there were 32, though fourteen double dipped from other groups.

In the "you got to play to win" category, i.e. (you only ran one event) an impressive additional 108 men and 80 women ran a **National Class** race. The majority were from the open division with 63 for the men and 44 for the women.

Eight runners, five who made the rankings, achieved **World Class** status: 90% Age Grade: Cindy Conant, 62, at 94.14% Perry Shoemaker, 52, 93.48%, Pete Gibson, 67, 92.79%, Jill Snyder, 63, 91.36%, and Isabella Strumke, 9, 90.44%. Deedee Loughran, 65, at 92.74% Yenew Alamirew, 33, 91.59%, and Amy Sachs, 37, 90.94% ran one event.

The top men at **National Class** were Hernan Garbini, 61, 89.68%, Adam Otstot, 41, at 88.94%, and Nicolas Crouzier, 38, 87.77%. Fourteen more men age graded better than 85%. The top women at **National Class** were Laura Labuschaigne, 27, 89.84%, Kendall Tata, 61, 87.68%, Alice Franks, 75, 86.99%, and Melissa Tanner 86.76%. Eight more women age graded better than 85%.

Runners who win the race or win their division in a race earn an asterisk beside their name. Open runners only earn an asterisk for an overall win. The Speed Alone is the fastest qualifying time run for each division. In red, it means the division champion ran it.

In the past, a runner beating another runner virtually ended a chance for the losing runner to prevail using the Moreland Racing Factor but we noted that time is of importance as well and runners do recover from a subpar event. Thus, we added to the accounting by giving runners a point for every second their best race beats their competitor's best race. Runners still lose eight points as well as gain eight points depending on which end of the head-to-head they fall on.

We now list the 10K equivalent of each runner's fastest race next to their spot in the ranking list. Remember, the fastest time is not always the best race and each runner has to finish at least two races to qualify.

Now let's see who made the top.

Open Men

Moore & Giles Virginia 10 Mile 48:08, 10K = 28:58 Yewen Alamirew age graded at **91.59%**

Thomas Adam won it all at the Pepsi 10K in 32:37, outside the top thirty events. Cole Shugart won it all at the Battlefield 5K in 15:32, slower than when he was 25th place last year. Who knew the final week they would be battling for the crown? Third Ranked Robert Creese laid down his best of three wins at the Charm City 20M in 1:48:51 and dared anyone to pass him. Shugart burst by first for the runner-up spot with his 24:27 Richmond 8K. He was followed home by fourth ranked Cedric Dressen (24:41) and sixth ranked Joe LoRusso (24:43). Adam, who had further to run did not finish his Richmond Half Marathon

(1:08:13) until later that morning but it catapulted him into the driver's seat and his first title.

Teen champion Carson Rackley matched Dreenen exactly with his Weighted Angels 5K in 15:01. Dreenen added two more overall wins with a best of 15:39 at the Harvest Hustle 5K. His next best event was Bank of Fincastle 5K in 16:13 to match Rackley's win at the City Point 5K River Run (16:13). Seventh ranked Pete Lomong offered up a solid Moore & Giles Virginia 10 Mile in 52:24, ahead of sixteenth place Ashenafi Birhana (53:12) and tenth place Eric Beyerle (53:46) as well as Dreenen (55:34). Beyerle added a Race for Every Child 5K in 15:12 that was enough to push him past the head-to-head with Birhana. Dreenen was supercharged enough to overcome his lesser event.

Eighth ranked Alexander Loper raced a marvelous Baltimore United Way 10K in 31:40 for second overall, while ninth ranked Roger Hopper (a recent champion) won it all at the Democracy Dash 10K in 31:38. Hopper added the Jamestown Half Marathon in 1:12:18. Loper added two faster races both second overall, the Charles Street 12M in 1:04:54 and the Charm City 20M in 1:53:23. Eleventh place James Heilman lost to fifteenth place Nicolas Crouzier at the Baltimore United Way 5K, 15:24 to 15:34, Still, he recovered later as second overall at the Oktoberfest 5M in 25:14.

Twelfth ranked Cody Hodgins defeated eighteenth ranked Jerry Greenlaw at the Army Ten Miler, 53:04 to 53:41. Graham Crawford takes the fourteenth position with a Bill Steer 4M in 20:04, second overall, combined with an overall win at the Veterans 5K in 15:33. In the battle of the marathons Jordan Tropf wins at the Marine Corps Marathon in 2:29:47 to take thirteenth place, while Robert Mazzanti raced the Richmond Marathon in 2:29:45 and is guided to nineteenth place. Tropf was second overall at the Parks Half Marathon in 1:11:29, ahead of Crouzier (1:13:11) and Birhana (1:13:18). Mazzanti ran Army in 55:44.

Cooper Groat ran a fine Richmond 8K in 25:23 for seventeenth place. Keith Carlson fills out the top twenty with a second overall at the Dulles Day 10K on the Runway in 32:31.

Forty made the Open division with fourteen coming from other divisions. David Wertz, 47, was the eldest. A total of one hundred and eighty-four other men ran one qualifying event.

Weighted Angel 5K 15:01, 10K = 31:19

Champion Carson Rackley bolted to the lead with an excellent 15:01 at the Weighted Angel 5K, second overall. Later, he confirmed his crown with an overall win at the City Point 5K River Run in 16:13. That same morning, runner-up Cooper Groat won it all at the Rocketts Landing Cap Trail 5K in 16:19, defeating fourth ranked Zachary Stevens (16:57) and sixth ranked Alexander Krack (17:07). Seventh ranked Enzo Coniglione ran well for second overall at the Run for Donuts 5K in 16:26.

Now it was coming down to the final weekend. Groat led the way at the Richmond 8K in 25:23 to take the runner-up spot. Travis Albon who had run the Moore & Giles Virginia 10 Mile in 57:15, came storming through the 8K in 25:56 to take spot number three. Stevens was next in 26:10, followed by Krack who ran 27:08. Andre Faigal won it all at the AS Metric Marathon in 1:34:13 to take fifth place.

Fourteen runners made the division. A total of one hundred and fifty-four other men ran just one qualifying event, with four at least **National Class**.

Richmond Half Marathon 1:08:13, 10K = 30:57

Alexander Loper placed his bid in early at the Charles Street 12M in 1:04:54. Ashenafi Birhana had been shut down by third ranked Nicolas Crouzier at the Parks Half Marathon, 1:11:18 to 1:13:11. He came storming back at the Moore &

Giles Virginia 10 Mile in 53:12 but settled for fourth place as Crouzier did the double. First, he was third overall at the Baltimore United Way 5K in 15:24. Then he did the Baltimore Half Marathon in 1:12:24. Loper pushed to the lead as second overall at the Baltimore United Way 10K in 31:40. Thomas Adam had won it all at the Pepsi 10K in 32:37 just one day before Loper was second overall at the Charm City 20M in 1:53:23.

Then Adam pulled out the stops at the Richmond Half Marathon to take the crown. Robert Mazzanti had a magical win at the Richmond Marathon in 2:29:45 to take sixth place. He had succumbed to fifth ranked Jerry Greenlaw at the DC Half marathon, 1:11:44 to 1:14:36. At the Army Ten Miler, Greenlaw was again victorious, running home at 53:41 to Mazzanti's 55:54. Steven Mance had his best race there in 54:14. It was not enough to overtake Mazzanti's marathon and gets him seventh place. Omari Daughtridge races the Navy Federal 5K in 15:45 to take ninth place.

Seventeen runners made the division. Fifty-five other men ran just one qualifying event, with nine at least **National Class**.

40-44 Men

Weighted Angels 5K 15:31, 10K = 32:22

Is Adam Otstot starting to slow? Or did he have an off day or two? He did what he needed to do at the Weighted Angels 5K (15:31) to take the title, though not the 15:24 of days of yore (2022). Forest Braden holds on to fourth place with his 15:50. However, at the Run for Hills 5K, though he did win it all in 16:47, it was a far cry from 2022's 15:49.

Carlos Renjifo was solid against seventh ranked Aaron Anderson at the Parks Half Marathon, 1:14:57 to 1:15:45. Still, let's hold the applause for the final weekend when the runner-up posted a poignant 1:12:23, taking down a fine 1:13:59 effort by fifth ranked Charlie Ban. Also there were eighth ranked Peter Derby (1:15:10) and ninth ranked Scott Ickes (1:15:36). And what has happened to the once iconic Great Allegany 15K where runners go to PR. Ban showed us a decent time of 51:40 but that took second overall with a mere seventy finishers. At my first experience with the event, 51:40 was 18th place and fourth master with close to two hundred finishers. Today 18th place is 71 minutes.

Four runners had a decent claim for this year's title. Our champion Steven Kast improved with each 5K he ran. His first was an age group win at the 5K with the fiercest competition, the Weighted Angels in 18:40. Steve Speirs had already raced the Chas Foundation 5K in 18:29 for one of his four wins. In October, Alex Hetherington took over the lead with a fine 1:03:17 at the Army Ten Miler to go along with his Parks Half Marathon in 1:26:58, ahead of Miguel Sanchez-Ruano 1:34:09. The last week of October, Kast edge up with a third overall at the Run for the Bulls 5K in 18:39. Speirs won the Anthem Wicked 10K in 38:43, ahead of tenth ranked Peter Pommerenk (40:27) and for him maybe the title was out of reach. Pete Wergin was successfully recovering from injury and planted his own 38:43 Rockville 10K into the conversation. That defeated eighth ranked Sanchez-

Ruano (39:30) and ninth ranked Gene Park (39:58). The following week, he quietly sauntered down to Kensington for the Park Run 5K and his 18:11 nudged Hetherington back to third. Four seconds earlier, Kast had finished his Riverwatch on the Piankatank 5K in Gloucester, and he broke the tape, scooting by Wergin for the title and coming, toppling Speirs to fourth place. Hetherington raced a credible 1:28:31 at the Richmond Half Marathon that same morning but that did not move him up.

I nearly fell off my chair when I saw that fifth place Colin Phillips had won it all at the 100th Baltimore and Annapolis Trail Park Run 5K in 18:47. Not because he won. That was a given; but like the other seven wins he had this fall and the 170 races before that, they were all at College Park. That would be 177 out of 307 events with scores of volunteering days there in between. Sixth ranked Mario Zuniga was gearing up for another JFK 50.2M, so he ran a half and then the Marine Corps Marathon. Thus, if he wanted a fast race it was going to have to come early in the season. Enter the Arlington Police Fire & Sheriff 9/11 Memorial 5K and a blazing 18:48 finish. And of course, it was du jour that he participate at the Greasy Gooney 10K. Imagine his glee when he finished second overall with a comfortable 42:39. Wilco Lagendyk ran a fine Monster Mash Dash 5K in 18:56. He broke the tie with Sanchez-Ruano with his Glory Days 5K in 20:02.

That was real close to what seventh ranked John Marsh did at Army (1:07:56) when he bested eighth ranked Mic Westmoreland (1:08:30) and twelfth ranked Jamie Ledwith (1:09:17). Of course, Garbini scorched the entire field with his win at 1:03:39. Sixthranked Brian Deutsch stole some thunder from Garbini's usual preferred event, running the only half marathon in the top sixty events. He was third at the DC Half Marathon in 1:29:48. For kicks, Garbini ended the season with by far the best 5K, winning the Veterans 5K in 18:31. Ninth ranked Tim Coady formulated five of his six wins at that distance. His best was the Louie Fields 5K in 19:41.

Kelvin Anderson and Aaron Baranowski duked it out for tenth place. Anderson was a hair faster at the Run for the Bulls 5K (20:02) then Baranowski had run the Chas Foundation 5K (20:03). And yet, Anderson got to see him finish from behind with (20:12). Baranowski also ran the Neptune Festival 8K in 31:59.

Still, his best race was the course-gifted Great Allegany 15K in a fine 1:04:14. Fourth ranked Stephen Chantry is famous for his epic battles with Chuck Moeser more than a decade ago. Chantry is one of just nine men to sweep an entire year in the rankings. George Yannakakis did it four times. Jack McMahan and the late Patrick Griffith did it twice. Chantry came back and faced Gibson at the Weighted Angels 5K. It was a massacre with Gibson pummeling him, 18:45

to 20:50. Ninth ranked Chris Abelt came in next with 22:28. By the end of the period, Chantry ran the Veterans 5K in 20:18 to close on Pointer.

Fifth ranked Bill Loomis is quietly improving his game and will soon be hammering the competition in the 70-74 division. His best race was the Stevensville Metric Half Marathon in 58:20. But it was at Army in 1:11:41 where he showed he was ready to roll. Seventh ranked Dave Wriston cued up a solid race at the High Bridge 5K in 22:06. Last fall's champion Eugene Myers acquired a few bruises early on and is still on the way back. Evidence: the Rockville 10K in 49:13, followed by the Bay Bridge 10K in 48:53 that earned him seventh place. Former champion Paul Ryan is still pounding out the wins. His best of four at the Anacostia Park Run 5K #211 in 23:35 gains eight place for him. Felix Lopez is moving up in the ranks to ninth place with his CASA Superhero 5K in 23:59. Chris Arey just does keep Larry Washington out of the top ten with his Baron "Deuce" Braswell II Run against Teen Violence 5K, run in 24:11. Washington enjoyed his best College Park 5K race in mid-September with 24:23.

Thirty-two runners made the division. A total of sixty-two other men ran just one qualifying event, with three at least **National Class**.

John Clarke has been the favorite but in this division changes can happen rapidly. Thirteen new faces appeared from last fall's total of thirteen, moving the division up to twenty competitors. Thomas Spasojevich, long the king of the Deep Run Park Run 5K, opened cautiously with a 42:12 that was near certain to give him a medal position. A month later, he was ready and let it all hang out for a division winning 33:16. Two weeks later, Clarke wrapped up the runner-up spot, winning the Spook Hill Cider & Wine 4 Mile in 45:14. That same morning, as if to say did you like my last race, he did something not yet done before. He matched his division winning 5K exactly with another 33:16.

Fourth ranked Dan Morgan nearly matched that feat, racing the Kensington Park Run 5K in 45:09 and then slowing slightly to 45:12. That event was one of three that had division competition as ninth ranked Michael Leonard ran in 47:30 behind Morgan's first race of the season in 46:21. Third ranked John Kurisky ended September, racing the odd distance Virginia 7.1K in 1:04:25. At another such event, the Bay Bridge 10K, fifth ranked Paul Jean finished in 1:34:53, ahead of tenth ranked Alan Firlein (1:46:43) and eleventh ranked Bobby Thompson (1:46:01). With all the waves (in the race, not in the bay) it is hard to tell who got to the finish line first. However the event awarded Firlein (7th) and Thompson (8th). Sixth ranked George Hastings ran more than twice as far as any other racer, winning the Richmond Half Marathon in 3:30:00.

Next up is the Richmond 8K, led by seventh ranked John Borkowski in 1:15:41, followed closely by eighth ranked John Holm (1:17:46). Fifteenth ranked John Lezzi ran home in 1:33:14 as third at the event to split between the next two in the rankings. Thirteenth ranked Harry Conn Jr. was out netted by seventeenth place Richard Nickerson but Conn Jr. holds place as he had two much better races, including the Margarita 5K in 53:57. Their real times for the 8K were, Conn Jr. (1:42:03) and Nickerson (1:45:31).

Twelfth place goes to Albert Vanocker at the huge Arlington Police Fire & Sheriff 9/11 Memorial 5K in 53:26. Fourteenth ranked Joseph Polinski raced the Chas

Foundation 5K in 55:49. As always, sixteenth ranked Michael McClellan can be found at the Park Run at College Park. His best race there was in 57:15. For Thanksgiving, the popular event featured 467 finishers which is believed to be a national Park Run 5K record. In the race designed to bring out the older runners, Get Ready! Get Set! Get Fit! 5K Run, Cliff Semmont returned to take eighteenth place with 1:08:51. And what is it about September 30th in Richmond? They have a 16.19K, a 7.1K and a 6.19K event at different venues. Nineteenth ranked John Votta ran the shortest one in 1:29:51. The Rockville 5K has been run since 1995 but has been run on about a half dozen different courses, not counting the couple of times that runners were accidently led off course. Our twentieth ranked runner, Sherman Fivozinsky finishing in 1:10:46.

Laura Labuschaigne won it all in the season's most competitive 5K in 16:55. Emma Rogers was the runner-up with a powerful 17:12. Fast forward to the final week and Labuschaigne was second overall at the most competitive 8K. Her Richmond finish was in 26:45. Julia Siegel Breton was top master there in 29:32 to take twenty-first place. Rogers won it all in the accompanying half marathon to cement her hold on the runner-up spot. Fifth ranked Laure Le Moigne PR'd in 1:17:11 to finished second overall. Also along for the ride was eleventh ranked Bridget Stacey (1:18:59), seventeenth ranked Susie Bousquet (1:22:01), and eighteenth ranked Beighley Ayers (1:22:16). At the Richmond Marathon, Ave Grosenheider brilliantly finishes second overall in 2:47:54 and secures post number ten in the rankings.

Meryem Erdogan got bronze at the prestigious Moore & Giles Virginia 10 Mile in 57:11, ahead of fourteenth ranked Cheyenne Leatham (1:00:38) and it gave Erdogan bronze in the rankings (third). Fourth ranked Tessa Barret as second overall beat Sydney Leiher at the DC Half Marathon by one second, 1:17:03 to 1:17:04. Also there was ninth ranked Rachel Viger (1:20:23) and nineteenth ranked Anna Crusier (1:22:55). Submaster's champion Le Moigne carved her way between Barret and Leiher with her Army Ten Miler in 59:15 as her second best event. Leiher ran the McLean 5K in 18:18, albeit an overall win. Back at the Army Ten Miler, seventh ranked Shauneen Werlinger had posted a marvelous 58:12 to erase the sting of losing to Le Moigne at the Parks Half Marathon, 1:21:53 to 1:22:14. Le Moigne was third overall behind race winner Erdogan's 1:18:00.

Viger won her age group at the Army ten Miler in 59:20, ahead of thirteenth ranked Anna Staats (59:54), sixteenth ranked Kristen Gray (1:01:01), and twentieth ranked Alison Baum (1:01:54). Back in Baltimore, masters legend Melissa Tanner won it all at the Charm City 20M in 2:02:36. The Open division is so strong that her best event was the eighth best event and only managed to

earn her eighth place. A week after Tanner beat all the men as well at the Western Maryland 10K in 37:30, twelfth ranked Natalie Daniels repeated the feat at the Ainsley's Angels 5K in 17:19.

The next fastest 5K belonged to fifteenth ranked Kennedy Weisner who ran the Veterans 5K in 17:44. Perry Shoemaker, 52, earns twenty-second place with her 37:33 at the Fall Classic 10K for the region's fastest ever for a grandmaster, not too far from the American record. She was the overall winner in all but one of her races where she tumbled all the way back to second place overall. Just out of range of the fall season and a few miles out of our region, she made a valiant try for the American record at the Rothman 8K in Philadelphia. The record is 28:55. Her time was 29:55. That is a 37:04 10K equivalent and just faster than the current American record for the 10K.

The division enjoyed fifty-five qualifiers, eighteen coming from other divisions with Perry Shoemaker eldest at fifty-two. A total of two hundred and four women ran just one qualifying event. Included was Isabella Strumke, 9, the 19 and younger champion, and Cindy Conant, 62, the 60-64 division champion.

Nancy Hill is a 5K winning machine. She laid down the three fastest 5Ks, including the two fastest races, led by the Cats and Bats Haunted 5K in 24:59. The Bay Bridge 10K is an adventure more than a race even though many did have swift times. Runner-up Janice Uthe just did crack the 50th best qualifier, albeit third place. Thus she needed her excellent Oktoberfest 5M in 42:41 the previous month to take her spot. Third ranked Linda Burrell did the deuce, finishing second place in both of her events. First, she ran Army in 1:32:13 ahead of fourteenth place Marcy Foster (1:37:35). Then she ended the season at the Richmond Marathon in 4:12:50 for the fourth fastest event. Seventh place Val Indye had by far her best race at the Fighter 5K in 26:54. Jean Phelan was wonderful at the Weighted Angels 5K in 27:12 to upset Shay (28:12) and Fricke (27:19) and best prolific racer Carol Hansen-Vessa who spends her days traveling between Williamsburg and Reston to race. She finished in 28:21 to take tenth place.

It is often a challenge when runners have a startling swift time on a 5K because just a little distance can wreak havoc with times. Rankings Explained - What It Is, Who Does It, How We Do It, and Where We are Going

The goal of the runner rankings is to rank the best runners of Washington, DC, Maryland, and Virginia, in five-year age groups, for the purpose of stimulating competition in the Washington region. Runners are ranked only according to performances in rated races. To be rated, a race must meet the following criteria:

- * Take place in Washington, DC, Maryland, or Virginia
- * Full results listed on the Web Site
- * Must list age (and preferably also city and state of residence) of all runners
- * Standard distance--5K, 4M, 8K, 5M, 10K, 12K, 15K, 10M, 20K, 1/2 Marathon, 25K, 30K, 20M, or Marathon
- * Road race or cross-country
- * Gun Time

To be included, a race must meet all of the above criteria. There will be no exceptions. If you place well in a race and want it included in the rankings, be sure to ask the race director to e-mail the complete results to us at runjames3@aol.com so that the race can be counted in the runner rankings.

Sometimes runners are confused by the race tracking terms. Chip time simply means that it was electronically timed, not manually. Gun time is the official time. Net time, which is confused with chip time, is merely a feel good time which is tracked by when the runner's chip first crosses the starting line. Net time will always be faster than the official gun time. Runners are welcome to note net time for their personal use but it has no place in the rankings. In large races, where it is impossible for runners to get to the start for many minutes after the official gun start, we do allow a net time to count as one of the necessary two qualifiers to allow a runner to be evaluated. However, that time and any net based age award placement in that race does NOT count towards their placement in the rankings.

Runners will be ranked by age divisions for both men and women, with the divisions being open, 19 & younger, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, and 90 & older.

The rankings are established using a nearly completely objective rating procedure. A preliminary sort, followed by an intensive analysis of competitive results, forms the rankings. The preliminary sort is based on the number of qualifying marks and best times. The final ranking is based on head-to-head competitive results against the other top placers (fifty percent), with time playing a major but secondary role (forty percent). Our general philosophy is that competition is about beating other runners and we intend to place an increased emphasis on competitive results.

To qualify for the end-of-year rankings, a runner must run two qualifying races in each of at least two of the four ranking periods. A runner can qualify for two different age groups in a year. As with the individual seasons, a runner can use a qualifying race from the elder division if it is fast enough to help qualify them for the younger division. Thus, the minimum number of races to double dip and qualify for two divisions would be six races. For example, a 60-64 runner runs a qualifying race twice in the winter or spring and then turns sixty-five after the winter and/or the two 60-64 qualifying races in the spring and qualifies for two of the next three seasons with times fast enough for qualification in the 60-64 division. A preliminary sort, followed by a more involved analysis of competitive results, also forms these rankings. The preliminary sort is based on seasonal rankings and best times. The final ranking is again based on head-to-head competitive results, with time playing a secondary role, though at times a deciding role. One special race can at times put a runner over the top, though consistency is a valued asset. I have devised the **Moreland Racing Factor** to help in deciding close contests.

Qualifying times are set in each age division for the 10K, and then adjusted for other distances. I believe in a constant time so that, while a runner may not make the top ten, he or she may consider himself or herself a ranked runner. My primary concern is that of believability. There should be few surprises. Competitiveness will always find a few disputes. Most runners know who they can best and who remains unbeatable. The rankings should fairly reflect that. Moreland Racing Factor

The Moreland Racing Factor (MRF) has been developed to serve as a check on the ranking process and to provide a status report on this ranking period. This new ranking system is not meant to supplant the old system. It will enhance and refine. It will give runners another look at the ranking process and help make the system more objective.

Just as with the quarterback rating in the NFL, the MRF will be loosely based on 95 points (140 with major races), with the premium coming from runners beaten either in the open category or in the age divisions. Runners earn points on their best races in a period based on the qualifiers below. A runner who wins five major races of five different distances would earn a perfect score of one hundred pure points. (75 for win, 15 for fastest, 5 for major, 5 for qualifier)

Masters runners are able to achieve higher numbers. Certainly, a masters runner who earned a hundred pure points is even more impressive than an open aged (20-34) competitor.

After the pure points have been parsed, we use the following to criteria to delineate racers in the same age group.

Head-to-Head 4 race - 8 major race (points for victor, negative points against loser)
 10K Equivalent - 1 (point for each second faster than opponent's best race versus their best race)

- Additional points can be earned by prevailing over your competition in the same races or by qualifying in more than five races (especially major races).
- Overall winners will be presumed as the 1st in the age group as well. Runners younger than 20 and older than 34 can earn overall winner points.
- Age groups will be determined by the races' scoring system (not necessarily five-year age groups). Runners who are in the overall award category of larger races will be presumed age group winners as well. (Allowing for multiple 1sts in the age group.) For instance, at the Twilight 8K, the top three masters in that special category are all age group winners as well as the winners in each of the individual age groups.

- The same applies for 2nd and 3rd in the age groups.
- The runners with the fastest times in individual distances will be awarded 3 points for each distance from 3M to marathon in that period. Ties give multiple runners points.
- Each time a runner qualifies with a race, he or she will get 1 point. It is possible to run more than five races in a period for additional points.
- Major races are defined as a race with more than 500 finishers or where more than 20% of the runners in that race qualify for the rankings.
- Major races score higher points.
- Each time a runner prevails over a runner with a ranked time in their division, he or she will receive 1 point. The point applies even if the runners beaten do not have a second qualifying race to make the rankings.
