(ix) List the great powers on the eve of 20th century that changed the face of Europe.  
(x) Why did England follow the policy of splendid isolation?  
[AI] (xi) Name the last Czar who ruled over Russia.  
(xii) Which treaty was signed with Austria?  
(xiii) What were the five bodies of the League of Nations?  
(xiv) How many judges are appointed in the Supreme Court of America?  
(xv) Mention at least one way in which the National Government tried to protect agriculture.  
[AI] (xvi) Who was Alexandrova?  
(xvii) What was the outstanding achievement of Mussolini regarding Church?  
(xviii) Which incident is referred to as 'Bloody Saturday'?  
(xix) When was the Enabling Law passed? Who passed it?  
(xx) What was Manchukuo?

- AI 4. Why did the British Government decide to send Simon Commission to India? Give an account of the agitation against the Simon commission in the years 1928-29. [12]
- AI 5. In the context of the Civil Disobedience Movement, discuss:
  - (a) The important features of the pact signed between Irwin and Gandhi. [6]
  - (b) The Award guaranteed on the basis of the community and the Pact signed at Poona. [6]
6. Write a detailed note on Deccan Riots of 1875. [12]

7. In reference to the relationship between Bismarck and the Socialists, state:
  - (a) The reason Bismarck tried to suppress the Socialists. [6]
  - (b) The reason Bismarck is referred to as an Iron Chancellor. [6]
8. Since the end of the Crimean War, England's foreign policy sank into "splendid isolation". In this context, answer the following:
  - (a) Why did England follow the Policy of Splendid Isolation? [6]
  - (b) Why did England decide to give up this policy? [6]
9. How successful was the Fascist state in solving Italy's economic problems? [12]
- AI 10. Germany described the Versailles Treaty as dictated peace. In this context, discuss the following:
  - (a) Germany's objection against the Versailles Treaty. [6]
  - (b) Justification of the Versailles Treaty. [6]
11. Russia's joining the First World War was a great blunder. In this context, discuss the following:
  - (a) The political impact of the War on Russia. [6]
  - (b) The economic impact of the War on Russia. [6]
