

When Seconds Count... Senior Fall Facts

What are the facts?


- According to the National Council on Aging, every year about one quarter of Americans over the age of 65 will a fall. Two-thirds of those who fall will fall again within six months.
- 94% of senior falls go unwitnessed.
- The majority, <u>55 percent</u>, of fall injuries among older people occurs inside the home and an additional 23 percent happen outside, but near the house.
- The risk of falling increases with age and is greater for women than men.



• Falls statistics in the elderly show that older people with hearing loss have three times the risk of an accidental fall.

All adults, aged 65 and over, are at risk for a fall.

- Many non-injury falls go unreported. <u>Seniors don't tell</u> <u>their doctors</u> (caregivers/family) they've had a fall because they are worried they will be told they can't live on their own anymore.
- Seniors also don't want others to worry about them. If they fall and don't have a serious injury, they don't want to bother their kids or loved ones.

Independent Living at Home vs Cost of Home Care / Assisted Living

- According to the *Genworth Cost of Care Survey 2004-2020*, the current annual cost for a private room in a nursing home is \$105,000+.
- Assisted living facilities, home health aides, and home care homemakers are nearly half the cost sitting around \$50,000 to\$55,000 annually.
