MUSIC NOTES

The music for the Grade 8 Award is taken from works by the Russian composer Piotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky (1840-1893). renowned for his ballet scores Swan Lake (1877), Sleeping Beauty (1890) and The Nutcracker (1892), and for his symphonic, instrumental and operatic works. The opera Evgenii Onegin (1877-8) is based on the famous 1833 versenovel of the same name by Aleksander Pushkin (1799-1837). and this work provides all the music for the barre, the entrée and finale polonaises and the Valse Printemps & demicaractère dance, as detailed below:

- **H12: Demi-caractère (Male only)** Themes from Piano Concerto No. 2 in G Major, 3rd Movement (Allegro con fuoco) op. 44 (1879-1880) is used by Balanchine (1904-1983) in *Ballet Imperial*
- 17 H17: Danse Russe (Female only) Danse Russe Op. 40 Nr. 10 (1878) is a transcription of Act III No. 20a from Swan Lake (1877)
