

Getting Started with LUSTER BRUSH

The Satin Ice Luster Brush contains 100% edible luster and a brush all in one, making it easy and fun to paint glittery accents on your creations such as cookies, cakes or cupcake toppers that have a hardened dry surface.



THE BASICS

WHAT ARE THE AVAILABLE COLORS?

Gold, Silver

WHAT IS THE FINISH?

The Luster Brush applies a translucent, shiny finish.

NUTRITION:

Vegetarian, Nut Free

STORAGE:

Brush should be capped when not in use with tip facing downwards. Store at room temperature.

DOES IT HAVE A FLAVOR?

The Luster Brush is tasteless and will not affect the taste of the creations it is applied to.

WHAT CAN IT BE USED ON?

Cupcakes, cookies, and cakes covered with fondant or royal icing that have a dry, hardened surface. This product is not for use on oil-based productes such as candy wafers and chocolate.

HANDLING

FOR BEST RESULTS:

- The pearlescent pigments naturally separate in the cartridge, shake before use.
- Slowly twist until the luster fills the brush tip. In case of splatters, twist away from the creation. Brush gently, for extra luster, brush a second layer once dry.
- After use, immediately wipe the tip with a clean, damp paper towel and tightly replace the cap.

WHAT'S THE BEST USE FOR THIS BRUSH?

The best use for the Satin Ice Luster Brush is to highlight over textured areas to bring out details and dimension of your design. Due to the translucent finish, it's not ideal for full coverage cakes and cookies.

IS THE LUSTER BRUSH FILLED WITH EDIBLE PAINT?

The Luster Brush applies like a paint but does not have a full coverage, opaque finish like an edible paint would.

WHY IS THE LUSTER SEPARATING IN THE CARTRIDGE?

The pearlescent pigments naturally start to settle and separate. Shake well before using so that the luster combines again.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO DRY?

The luster will dry after a couple of hours.

IS IT RECOMMENDED TO APPLY MULTIPLE COATS?

If you want more coverage or the shimmer to show up more, you can apply a second coat after the first coat starts to dry,
