Vialoco Safety Advice

It's important to make sure you ride your e-scooter safely to protect yourself from potential harm. Here's a handy guide to make sure you're riding safely:

1. What to wear

Number one- helmet. It's hugely important that you wear a safety helmet whenever you ride your scooter. It's also a good idea to wear elbow pads and knee pads, especially as you're starting out and getting used to your scooter. It's also advisable to wear light or fluorescent colours when riding.

2. Make sure to have lights on your scooter

If your e-scooter doesn't have inbuilt lights and you'll be riding in low light or night, it's essential to make sure you get some lights. It's recommended to get lights for both the front and rear of the scooter.

3. Be aware

Be aware of your surroundings and do not move at speed when passing others. Never ride a scooter on the pavement and never ride with more than one person the scooter. Don't consume alcohol when riding your electric scooter. If you are using a phone for directions, it's recommended to buy a mobile phone holder.

Make sure to use a lock whenever leaving your scooter for a period of time.

Keep an eye on the weather conditions and check your scooter manual to see if it's suitable to be driven in rain. If you're new to you scooter, it's suggested to avoid slippery conditions, until you're a more experienced rider.

4. Check the instruction manual

Make sure to read the instruction manual before you get on your scooter to ensure you ride safely. You need to know how to charge it, how it folds, how to work the additional features and so on. Remember that you can void your warranty if you don't use the scooter correctly, so it's important to read the full manual.

5. Keep your scooter in perfect condition

To keep your scooter in good working condition, it's important to regularly check your tyre pressure, brakes, bodywork and battery. Before every ride, make sure to follow these three steps:

- Check if there is sufficient tyre pressure
- Check if the folding mechanism is firmly in place
- Check that your brakes are functioning correctly
- Check your lights, if fitted, are working

Remember it's not a race and it may take you a couple of rides to get used to your scooter. Ride safe, be aware and have fun!
