Shabazi St 67, Tel Aviv-Yafo

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Neve Tzedek was the first Jewish neighborhood built outside the walls of Jaffa, back in 1887 — even before Tel Aviv officially existed.

But with the rise of Tel Aviv, the area slowly fell into neglect, and by the 1960s, it had become one of the city's slums.

In the 1980s, Neve Tzedek began to bloom again. Restoration efforts brought life back to its old houses.

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Suzanne Dellal Centre is Israel's leading venue for contemporary dance and ballet.

120 years ago, one of these buildings housed a boys' school, and just across the way stood a girls' school where all the teaching was done in Hebrew.

That may not sound unusual today, but back in the late 19th century, it was revolutionary in Jewish society, where many girls didn't receive an education at all.

Coffee time #1

If you're looking for something a little different, something with flavor and feeling, this is the place. The menu is creative and carefully crafted. The coffee is great, too — but here, the dishes steal the show.

Perfect blend of French patisserie and Mediterranean spice. Try crusty sourdough loaves, and pastries infused with local flavors like halva, pistachio, and date.

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Gutman Museum stands in a house where his childhood unfolded. In the early 1900s, this building was home to a Hebrew-language newspaper. His father, writer Alter Gutman, worked in the editorial office — and Nahum played and sketched up the world around him.

Shim'on Rokah St 21, Tel Aviv-Yafo

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Let's take a walk through the park on the southern edge of Neve Tzedek — a spot that used to be “Street No. 3871.” If that doesn't ring a bell, here's a clue: this is where Ottoman train used to pass — connecting Jerusalem and Jaffa. You can still spot the old train rails running through the pavement.

Park HaMesila

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A perfect stop for a delicious bite.

Try the **Jachnun** — a beloved Israeli dish with Yemeni roots, made of slow-cooked rolled puff pastry.

And for dessert, don't miss the divine **tahini truffle** — rich, nutty, unforgettable.

ELIFELET cafe

Park Hamesila, Elifelet St, Tel Aviv-Yafo

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Pass the light rail station from the right, and you'll see the entrance to HaTachana Park.

This restored railway station was part of the Jaffa–Jerusalem line, which operated from 1892 to 1948.

Today, it's a popular spot for locals to relax, with cafés, shops, and creative studios
