





Folding Foraging Pouch

MATERIALS:


- 2 x A4 Soft leather pieces
- 1 x firmer calf leather
- 4 x small rivets to attach belt loop
- 2 x Stitching needle
- 1 x Length of waxed thread
- 1 x Sam Browne Button Stud fastener
- 1 x lace for drawstring
- 1 x Large bead or button

• YOU WILL NEED:

- Awl or stitching chisel to make stitch holes
- A rotary or drive punch to make the pouch drawstring holes
- A craft knife or sharp scissors.
- A mallet to set the rivets for the belt loop



Code:





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A folding drawstring bag incorporated into leather outer pouch that can be attached belts or kit bags. The pouch itself can be made from a fine soft leather or a waxed cotton, both materials that are breathable.



Instructions:

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1. **Add Sam Browne button stud fastening**— screw the Sam Browne stud into place in the hole on the front section of leather. *Tip: add a little glue to the screw for added fixing.*





2. Add the belt loop to the firm pouch cover where marked, using the rivets supplied. (See the enclosed Guide to Setting Rivets), alternatively hand sew in place.



- 3. Take one piece of the A4 soft leather and attach the firm pouch cover piece stitching in place where marked on the template.
- 4. Punch holes out around the top of the 2 A4 pieces.
- 5. Take the 2 x A4 sized pieces of soft fine leather or waxed cotton and hand or machine sew round the three sides we used blanket stitch.
- 6. Thread through the drawstring and add beads to help lock the drawstring when needed.
