

BLOCKY BLOCK QUILT

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:




2 1/2 Yards

- (4) 1 3/4" x WOF
- (22) 2 1/2" x WOF
- (40) 4" x 6"



1 1/4 Yard

- (20) 5" x 5"
- (40) 4" x 6"





3/4 Yard


- ☐ (4) 1 3/4" x WOF
- ☐ (6) 2 1/2" strips for binding

STEP 1:

Take your Fabric A 4" x 6" rectangles and mark the wrong side diagonally. Then, take one marked rectangle and place it on top of your fabric B 4" x 6" rectangle with the right side down. Place it at an angle as shown below. Sew 1/4" on each side of your marked line.



Cut your marked line. This will create two half-square rectangles. You will need four for one block. Open and press.



Next, we will need to square the half-rectangles. Use a ruler with a 60 degree mark, and line it up on the diagonal of your half-rectangle. Turn your ruler upside down to square the other side. Then, cut your block to 3" x 5".

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STEP 2:

Take your 1 3/4" x WOF fabric A and C strips and place them right sides together. Sew 1/4" down one side.



Don't open and press yet. Take your sewn strips and cut 1" x 3/4" pieces from your strip. Once they are cut, open and press your squares.




Sew your squares into a block so the colors are alternating. Place with right sides together and sew at 1/4". You will need four checkered boxes for each block.




STEP 3:

Lay out your block as shown below. Use your 5" x 5" fabric B square for the middle.




Piece your block in horizontal rows, sewing with right sides together with a 1/4" seam. Sew your rows together in the same way.




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STEP 3:

Next we will create sashing out of the 2 1/2" x WOF fabric A strips. Place your strip on one side of your block and sew at 1/4". Cut off the end and press open. Set aside the excess.




Repeat this step on 3 more blocks to create 1 row. Sew them with right sides together, non-sashing side to sashing side. Add one more sashing piece to your right side.



Repeat this step on 3 more blocks to create 1 row. Sew them with right sides together, non-sashing side to sashing side.


This quilt has 5 rows. Sash the top and bottom of 3 of them.



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STEP 4:

Sew your two non-top-sashed rows inbetween your sashed rows as shown below.



Quilt and bind as desired!

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
