
Cherry Wood Wave



Materials:



Fabric A: 8 different Fat Quarters

Cut (2) 10" squares from each fat quarter



Fabric B: 11/4 yards


Cut (16) 10" squares

Binding: 1/2 yard or leftover scraps from fat quarter Backing: 2 3/4 yard

Sewing Instructions:

Let your creative side out with this fun and whimsical block pattern. There are no rules when it comes to making these large swerved cuts.

Place a black square and a colored square together. Using a rotary cutter, free hand cut a swerve through the middle of the block. Match a color and a black from each side of the cut.








Place a set right sides together. The edges will not match, they represent each side of the swerved cut. Starting at one end sew the swerved edges together using a 1/4" seam allowance, manipulating the top piece to follow the shape of the bottom. This part will feel a bit awkward, but it works! Snip any strong curves as needed to help the block lay flat once it's ironed open. Repeat for all blocks.





Once all the blocks have been sewn together, lay them out in alternating directions as desired. Sew each block together in a row, then sew the rows together.
