## Materials:

## Fabric A: 12 Different Fat Quarters for background and sashing

From each fat quarter:
Cut (4) 5 " squares; for a total of 40
Cut (2) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares; for a total of 20
Cut (7) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles; for a total of 80
Cut (1) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, plus an additional (3) from any color; for a total of 15 for the vertical sashing

Cut (1) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF (21" approx.) for a total of 12 ; sew these together end to end and create (4) 52" lengths for the horizontal sashing. Trim to fit quilt top before sewing.

## Fat Quarter

Fabric B: $13 / 4^{" 1}$ yards for churn dash accent

> Cut (5) $5^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips Subcut (40) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares
> Cut (5) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips
> Subcut (80) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

Binding: $1 / 2$ yard Backing: $31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$

## Assemble Half Square Triangles:

Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on all of the 5" squares of fabric B. Match them up to all of the 5 " squares from Fabric A and sew $1 / 4$ " down either side of the marked line. Cut along the mark, creating 2 half-square triangles. Press and Trim to 4 1/2" square. Make 80 HST.

## Assemble Strip Units:

Take all the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from Fabric $A$ and $B$. Combine one from each fabric and sew together. It should now measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ 1/2". Make a total of 80 units.


## Build Churn Dash:

Mixing up the colors, create 20 churn dash blocks according to the diagram. Square to 12 1/2".


Set the finished blocks into rows of 4. Sew a sashing strip from Fabric A between each unit. Create 5 rows. Sew the rows together using the previously created horizontal sashsing strips between each row.
