Backing Fabric – 4 yards Binding Fabric – 1/2 yard

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

Cutting Instructions:

Follow the diagrams on this page and the next page on how to cut each 6 1/2" Vegas Strip. When you cut each strip leave them folded from selvage to selvage. **Note:** If using yardage, just follow the same instructions, except you will cut all your strips the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage.



Sewing Instructions:


Half Square Triangles (HSTs) – For Block 1

Pair up all the 4" squares (Fabrics A, C) with right sides together. Follow the three steps below.

Step 1: Stitch around all four sides using a 1/4" seam allowance.	Step 2: Cut diagonally from corner to corner in both directions.	Step 3: Press them to the darker fabric.


Assemble Block 1:

Lay your HST squares and 2 1/2" squares as shown below. Now, sew row 1 and press towards the square. Sew the next row and press towards the square (Figure 1). Sew the rows together and press towards the second row (Figure 2). Make a total of 60 blocks (Figure 3). Set them aside.




Assemble Block 2:

Lay your triangles and square as shown below. First, flip the top triangle onto the square aligning the sides (Figure 1). The tip will hang off slightly. Stitch across then press towards the triangle. Next, flip the side triangle onto the square (Figure 2). Stitch across then press towards the triangle. Lastly, flip the large triangle (Figure 3) and line it up with the lower left corner. Stitch across then press towards the triangle for 33 blocks and press towards the pieced half for the remaining 27 blocks. Make a total of 60 blocks (Figure 4). Set them aside.




Assemble Rows:

Lay your blocks as shown below. Sew all your rows together, press each row in the direction of the arrows shown in Figure 1. Pressing this way will help in nesting the rows as you sew row to row.



Add the Inner and Outer Borders:

Sew three of the 1 1/2'' strips from Fabric C together into one long strip, then subcut two of the strips that measure 1 $1/2'' \times 48 1/2''$ each. Next, take the remaining two 1 1/2'' strips and subcut them to measure 1 $1/2'' \times 42 1/2''$. Sew the longer strips to the left and right side first pressing towards the border, then sew the shorter strips to the top and bottom pressing them towards the border.



For the outer border, sew all five strips cut earlier from Fabric B and sew them into one long strip. From this strip, subcut four strips measuring $1 \frac{1}{2}$ x 50". Sew a strip to the left and right side of the quilt, then press towards the border. Sew the last two strips to the top and bottom, then press towards the border. Your quilt top is now complete. Quilt as desired and enjoy.
