Nine Patch Tree Skirt

## Materials:



Fabric A: dark red
(16) 3" squares

Fabric B: bright red
(64) 3 " squares

Fabric C: dark green
(64) 3" squares

Fabric D: bright green
(69) 3" squares

Fabric E: brown
(76) 3" squares

Fabric F: yellow
Cut (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for binding Cut (2) 2" x WOF strips for ties

Backing: $11 / 4$ of $44^{\prime \prime}$ wide fabric

## Nine Patch:

Make (16) nine patch blocks by sewing the 3 " squares together as follows:


## Vertical Sashing:

Make (12) vertical sashing strips by sewing (3) 3" squares together as follows; beginning with brown


## Horizontal Sashing:

Make (5) horizontal sashing strips by sewing (15) 3" squares together as follows; beginning with brown.


## Side Vertical Sashing:

Make (2) vertical sashing strips by sewing (17) 3" squares together as follows; beginning with bright green.


## Put Rows Together:

Create a nine patch row by alternating a nine patch with a vertical strip as follows; creating a total of four rows


Add the 5 horizontal sashing strips in between each nine patch row connecting them all together. Add sashing strips to the top and bottom of this uit as well. Sew on the 2 side vertical sashing strips the left and right completing the unit.


At this stage, quilt the unit as desired with batting and backing.

## Create the Circle:

Find the center of the quilt unit, and trace the circle using the template provided. To trace the outer circle, use a piece of string (approx. 30" long) tie it to a pencil/stick, place that in the center of the middle circle. Measure out to the edge of the quilted unit and tie the other end of the string to a marking pen. While holding the pen and pencil taught, trace around the entire circumference of the quilted unit. Draw a straight line from the center circle to the outer circle for the opening of the tree skirt. Cut along all of the marked circles and line.


Prepare ties, by folding 2 " strips in toward the center and then again to enclose the raw edges. Hem each end as well, by folding those in $1 / 4$ ". Top stitch along the edge and split the length in half creating a total of 4 ties. Baste these in place along the opening of the tree skirt as pictured.


Bind entire circumference of the skirt. Enjoy!
