Sew Yeah Quilting

## Materials:

Fabric A, B:
Cut four 2 1/2" squares Cut eight 11/2" squares

Fabric C, D:
Cut four 2" $\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles Cut four 2" squares
Fabric E:


Cut two 3" squares

## Fabric F:

Cut four 2" squares

## Fabric H:

Cut two 3" squares

## Fabric G, I, J, K, L, M:

Cut four 11/2" $\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Cut four 2" $\times 3^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Cut four 2" squares
Cut four 11/2" $\times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Cut four 11/2" $\times 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Cut eight 11/2" squares

## Sewing Instructions:

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of $8 B$ pieces and $8 M$ pieces. Place an $M$ piece on the top right corner of an $A$ piece and sew on the drawn line. Trim away excess fabric, leaving $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press. Repeat with another $M$ piece in the top left corner ( $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ).

Repeat to make a total of $4 \mathrm{~A} / \mathrm{M}$ units. Using the same process explained above, repeat with the $B$ and $K$ pieces to make $4 B / K$ flying geese units (11/2" $\times 2$ 1/2").
2. Sew one $B / K$ flying geese unit to the bottom of one $A / M$ unit and press (2 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ). Repeat with the other $A / M$ and $B / K$ units.
3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the J squares. Place a J square on the top right corner of a $C$ rectangle. Sew along marked line. Trim away excess fabric, leacing a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press ( 2 " $\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ). Place another J square on the top left corner of another $C$ rectangle. Sew along the marked line. Trim away excess fabric, leacing $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press ( $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3$
 $\left.1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$. Repeat to make 4 sets of C/J units.
4. Repeat step 3 using the $D$ squares and I rectangles to make 4 sets of D/I units ( $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$ ).
5. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the H squares. Align the E and H squares, right sides together. Sew along both sides of the drawn line with a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Cut along the drawn line. Makes 2 half square triangle blocks (HST). Open and press both HSTs. Trim HST units to measure 2 1/2" $\times 2$ 1/2". Repeat to make a total of 4 HSTs.
6. Lay out pieces and sew as illustrated. Sew sections into rows. Press to complete the Tuplip Block (10 1/2" x 10 1/2").
