## Materials:



Fabric A: Dark 3/4 yard or 4 Vegas Strips
Cut (4) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF Strips
Subcut (8) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 12 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Subcut (8) $61 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$ squares

## Fabric B: Medium 1 yard or 5 Vegas Strips

Cut (4) $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF Strips
Cut (4) $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle
Cut (16) $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric C: Light l yard or 5 Vegas Strips

Cut (4) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF Strips
Cut (4) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 121 / 2 / 2$ rectangle
Cut (16) $6 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ " squares


Fabric D: Background $21 / 4$ yard or 12 Vegas Strips
Cut (7) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF Strips
Subcut: (40) $6 \frac{112 " \prime}{2 \prime} \times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ squares, save remaining strip for border Cut (5) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Strips for border plus the remainder of the previous cut

Backing: 37/8 yards Binding: $1 / 2$ yard or 3 Vegas Strips cut into $21 / 2$ " strips

## Half Square Triangles:

Make 6 HST: Take 2 each of the $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ squares from Fabrics A, B \& C, along with 6 squares of Fabric D. Mark a diagonal line on each of the Fabric D squares. Place one square from Fabric D onto each of the squares from Fabrics A, B \& C. Sew along the marked line. Leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance, trim off one side of the HST. Press seam to the dark side. Square to $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Flying Geese:

Flying Geese \#1 (light): Take the $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 121 / 2$ " strip from fabric C and 2 squares from Fabric D. Mark a diagonal line on each square. Place the square onto the top left corner of the rectangle, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim off the excess leaving a $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance. Press open. Place the 2 nd square on the top right corner, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim the excess and press open. Block should measure $61 / 2^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Flying Geese \#2 (medium): Take the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 "}$ strip from fabric B and 2 squares from Fabric C. Mark a diagonal line on each square. Place the square onto the top left corner of the rectangle, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim off the excess leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press open. Place the 2 nd square on the top right corner, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim the excess and press open. Block should measure $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Flying Geese \#2 (dark): Take the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from fabric A and 2 squares from Fabric B. Mark a diagonal line on each square. Place the square onto the top left corner of the rectangle, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim off the excess leaving a $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance. Press open. Place the 2 nd square on the top right corner, RST and sew along the marked line. Trim the excess and press open. Block should measure $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Lay out one unit-

Gather all of the blocks that have been created, along with 2 squares of Fabric $D$ and 1 rectangle from Fabric $A$. Lay out all of the pieces according to the diagram. Sew each row together, then sew the rows together. This unit should measure $241 / 4$ " square. Repeat this process 3 more times for a total of 4 complete units.


With all 4 completed units, lay them out as follows and sew them together.


Completed unit should measure approximately 48 " square. Sew the border strips from Fabric $D$ together, end to end, then cut the necessary lengths to add the borders to the sides and then the top and bottom of the quilt top.
