Student Activities – (NB Make into individual activity cards if desired).

Activity 1 – Write a comment card about this book to go in the library. Explain why you think other students would enjoy reading this book.

Activity 3 – Design a bookmark for this book. Include the title, author and illustrator names.




Activity 5 – Ask others in your class (at least 20) what pets they have. Make a tally chart for this. You might like to use "No pets" as one of the options. Use your tally chart to draw a bar graph or make a pictograph to show the results. Optional -Under the graph write 3 questions that others can find the answer to if they look at your graph.

Activity 2 – Eugene was missing his pet dog Jupiter. List at least 5 things you think Eugene may have missed the most about not being able to have Jupiter with him. Explain your reasons.


Activity 4 – If you have a pet draw a picture of it or use a photo of it and write a short description about it. Tell about some of the things you do with your pet, what it looks like and what it likes to do. Why is your pet important to you? *If you do not have a pet* then write about what pet you would choose and why. Write about what activities you would do with it.

Activity 6 – (Teacher assistance required) Look at one of the websites about kiwi. Use 5 facts to make information cards/poster or a small booklet about the kiwi that would be useful and inform

others.



This book could be read and used as part of the Health Wellbeing, Science, The Arts and Literacy areas. The student activities could be used as individual activity cards once a student has read the book or as class/group activities. Some may need teacher led depending on the age group students or learning space. Some will need teacher assistance and are noted as such. The ideas listed below are in no way definitive. Using knowledge their children teachers select, modify, and recreate any of the below suggestions.


Activity 9 – Using a poem format you know, write a poem about your pet or the kiwi. Use exciting describing and action words. Include how your pet / kiwi may make you feel. You may like to try an ABC poem where you write one word for each letter of the alphabet to describe your pet /kiwi.

Activity 10 – In a group make a list of 20 words about the kiwi or Eugene's Island. Make a Word Search for the class with these words. Ask your teacher for a grid to write your words in.

Activity 11 – Ask your teacher for the kiwi colouring sheet. Once you have coloured it, on another sheet write some information about the kiwi that you have learned.
